Soil Conservation District, the annual winner Conservation Man of the Year, Grass Man of the Year. Tickets for the banquet are on sale by Farm Bureau members, supervisors of the Heppner Soil Conservation District, First National Bank, and at this office.
Word has just been received from the Tillamook County Dairy Herd Improvement association that quality dairy calves are again available for shipment beginning now. Jerseys and Guerneys are available and come in two grades. The superior grade heifers will be from dam producing from 425 pounds to 500 pounds and above butterfat and will sell for \$26.75. The standard breed heifers will be from dam with production records from 350 to 425 pounds of butterfat. Order blanks are available from this office.
Don Robinson, San Hollow Hereford breeder, called at the office a few days ago to report that the Round-Up polled Hereford sale which will be held at Pendleton on November 11. The show and sale will be held the same day with the show beginning at 9 a.m. and the sale at 1 p.m. Forty-three bulls and 11 heifers are consigned from breeders from Oregon, Washington and Idaho. To be consigned from Morrow county are three heifers and two bulls from the Kirk and Robinson Hereford ranch and

three bulls from Bernard Doherty, Heppner. The sale will be held at the Round-up grounds, sales barn.
While visiting with Don, some interesting information was received from him concerning the recent disposal sale of the Four Daughters Polled Hereford ranch at Ellensburg, Wash. Don Robinson and Jack Sumner, polled Hereford breeders, assisted in preparation of the 208 lots in the sale. Don reported in one day he had culled and otherwise prepared for showing 60 head in one day. As many as 115 per day were washed in the the week, washing, curling, trimming and breaking to lead the cattle. This disposal, which contained some of the outstanding polled Herefords in the whole country, averaged over \$1,000 per head to set somewhat of a record. Purchased and brought back to Morrow county were a bull by Don Robinson and 2 cows, 2 calves and a bull by Jack Sumner. The bull purchased by Don was a half brother to one that he bought from Four Daughters last spring. Don reported that the bull which he had leased from Four Daughters last summer and returned this fall was not sold but kept by the manager who is starting a herd of his own. Don feels fortunate that he had 30 cows bred to this bull for which an offer of \$10,000 was made and turned down.
