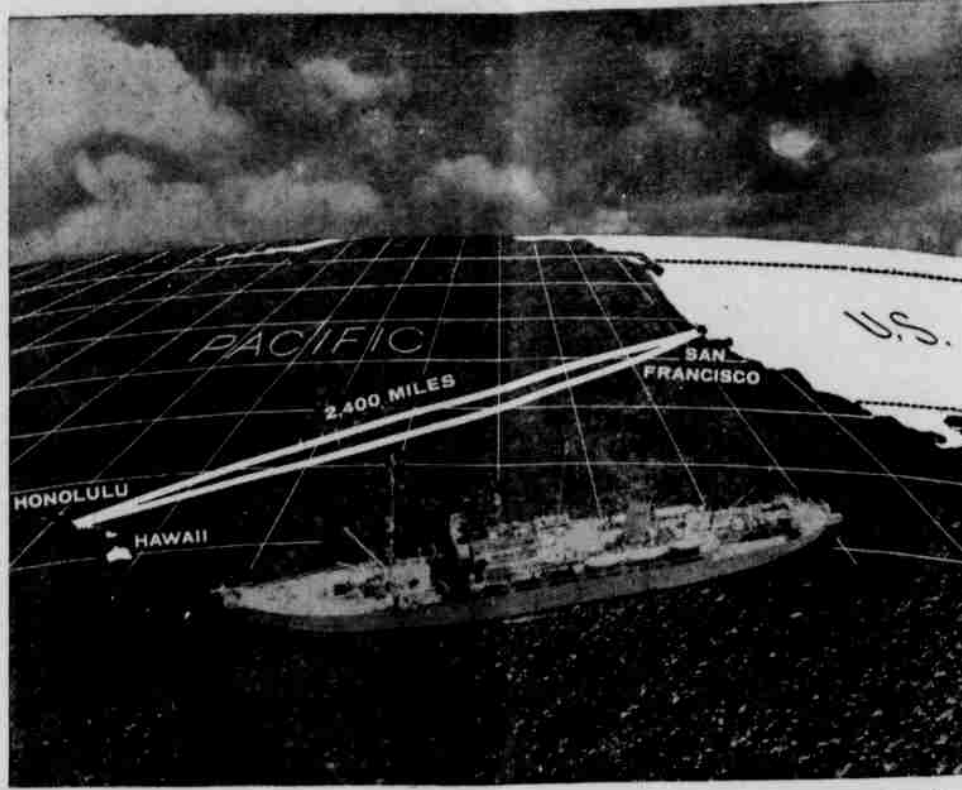


### District FFA Meet Held at Boardman

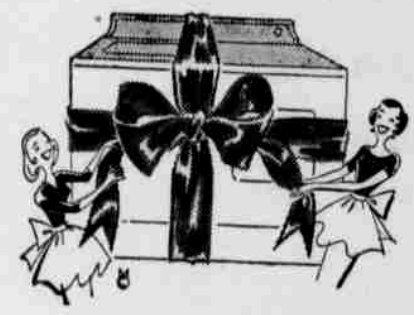
