Copies are available on request to Oregon residents at all county extension offices or from the OSC bulletin clerk.

Beginning cooks and experienced hands alike can produce excellent pies by following recipes carefully, says author Mrs. Ruth Klippstein, OSC's nutrition specialist.

An outline of ingredients needed for good pastry, method of mixing, baking instructions, and suggested fillings and toppings are included in the circular. It is punched for easy insertion into standard cookbooks or notebooks.

Recipes for soft wheat flour crust, meringue shells, Oregon walnut pie, and a new pretzel crust for cheese pies, are all found in the circular.
