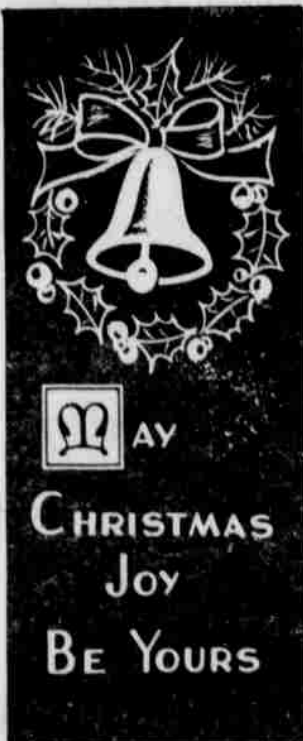

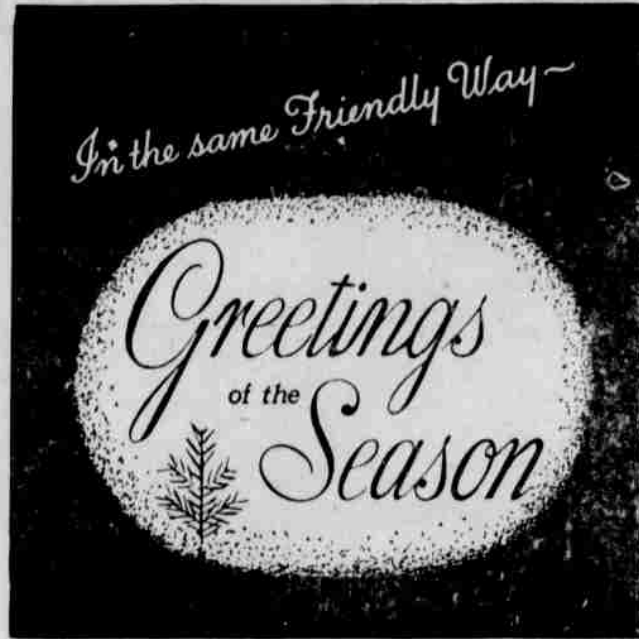

Coconut Shortbread Crust

- 1/2 cup butter
- 3 tablespoons sugar
- 1 egg yolk
- 1 cup sifted flour
- 1 cup Baker's Angel Flake Coconut

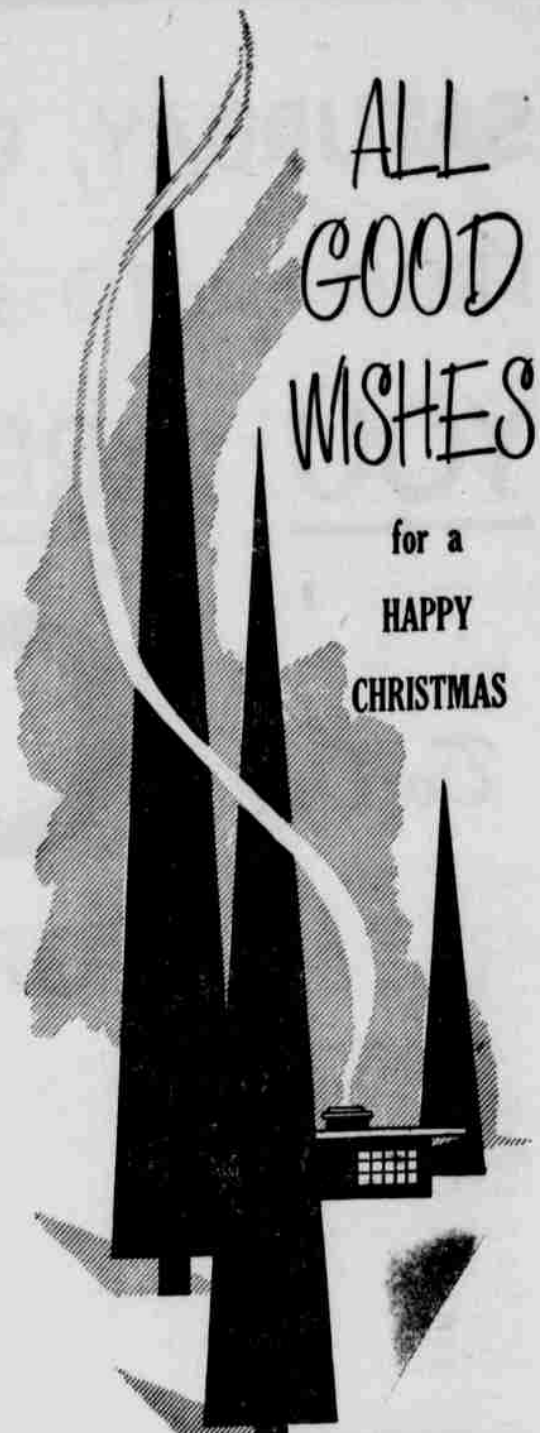
Cream butter and sugar. Add egg yolk and blend well. Add flour, mixing thoroughly. Then add coconut. Pat mixture into 9-inch pie pan. Chill 30 minutes, then bake in moderate oven (350° F.) 25 to 30 minutes, or until browned. Cool.
