BACK FROM DESPAIR Cameron Rebuilding Better Community on Ruins of Old

Cameron is coming back. The town which felt the brunt of Hurricane Audrey's assault on the southwestern Louisiana coastline last June is rebuilding rapidly after being nearly leveled.

In many ways—through disaster funds administered by the Federal Civil Defense Administration, and through \$3,000,000 from the Red Cross and gifts from many parts of the nation, including even donations of labor by contractors and construction unions from nearby Texas. Cameron is also coming back through its own efforts. What is one of the nation's first disaster planning commissions has been set up there. It will oversee the rebuilding of most of Cameron within nine months, allocating gifts and other resources as it sees fit.

In time, it should be a better town than it was. In the past, Cameron and its neighboring communities, Creole and Grand Chenier, each had a tiny clinic. Now they will have a new Cameron Memorial Hospital, built with the help of Federal funds, the American Legion, and others. The Junior Chamber of Commerce will build a public library, which the town has never had.

Even 34 college students, whose resources were wiped out by the hurricane, will be able to continue in school through help received from the Louisiana Department of Education.
