 my hope that the state departments of the Oregon government will be able to work at their fullest efficiency. The State Industrial Accident Commission has kept Oregon's premium rates lower than those of comparable states and the cost of administration now is the lowest among similar agencies of the entire nation. Time lag on claims processing has been cut down the past year and disposition of claims appealed to the commission has been speeded up with increased efficiency.

**Farm Crop Prices Down 4% in 1957; Livestock Up 7%**

More produce worth less money—that was the picture facing Oregon farmers as they harvested their 1957 crops, according to Mrs. Elvera Horrell, extension agricultural economist at the Oregon state college. Better livestock prices during the year came to the rescue, however, and helped the state's farmers fare about as well as the year before.

U S department of agriculture reports show Oregon farm prices last year averaged somewhat above 1956, even though prices were lower at the end of the year than at the start, Mrs. Horrell found. Crop prices averaged 4 per cent lower than in 1956 and it was up to livestock prices chalking up a 7 per cent gain to account for the higher average.

But prices paid by farmers, nationally, for production items rose nearly 4 per cent during the year to an all-time high, Mrs. Horrell said. Farmers' buying power, as expressed in the national parity ratio—the relationship between prices received and prices paid farmers—averaged 82 for the year, the same as in 1956. Oregon's crop harvest in 1957 was good due to excellent grow-

ing conditions and ideal harvesting weather. Crop tonnage, when the final count was made, topped 1956 production by 7 per cent. But Mrs. Horrell calculated that the farm value of these crops fell short of 1956 by a like amount.

Looking at 1957 crops, group by group, Mrs. Horrell found that the state produced more field crops, and tree fruits and nuts but less seed crops and vegetables than a year earlier. Only the tree fruits and nuts group was valued higher than in 1956 as increases in the value of apples, cherries, filberts, and walnuts more than offset lowered values on pears, peaches, and prunes.

Value of vegetable crops remained about the same in 1957 as in 1956, with fresh market vegetables down a trifle and processing vegetables a little higher. Seed crops were spotty and averaged about a fifth lower. Berry values skidded 12 percent. Field crop values, which account for about three-fifths of the crop value in the state, were off 88 percent.

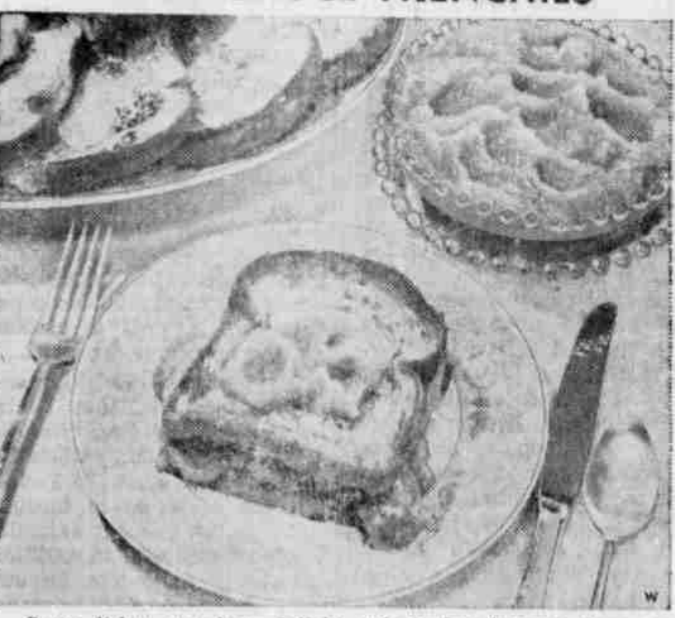

Combine apple sauce, spices and butter; heat. Beat eggs, add milk and salt. Dip bread slices in egg mixture; brown on both sides in butter or margarine. Serve hot apple sauce mixture between each two slices of French toast. If desired, garnish top with spoonful of apple sauce. Makes 4 servings.
