Mr and Mrs Frank Hamlin were called to Gresham on Saturday by the serious illness of his brother-in-law.

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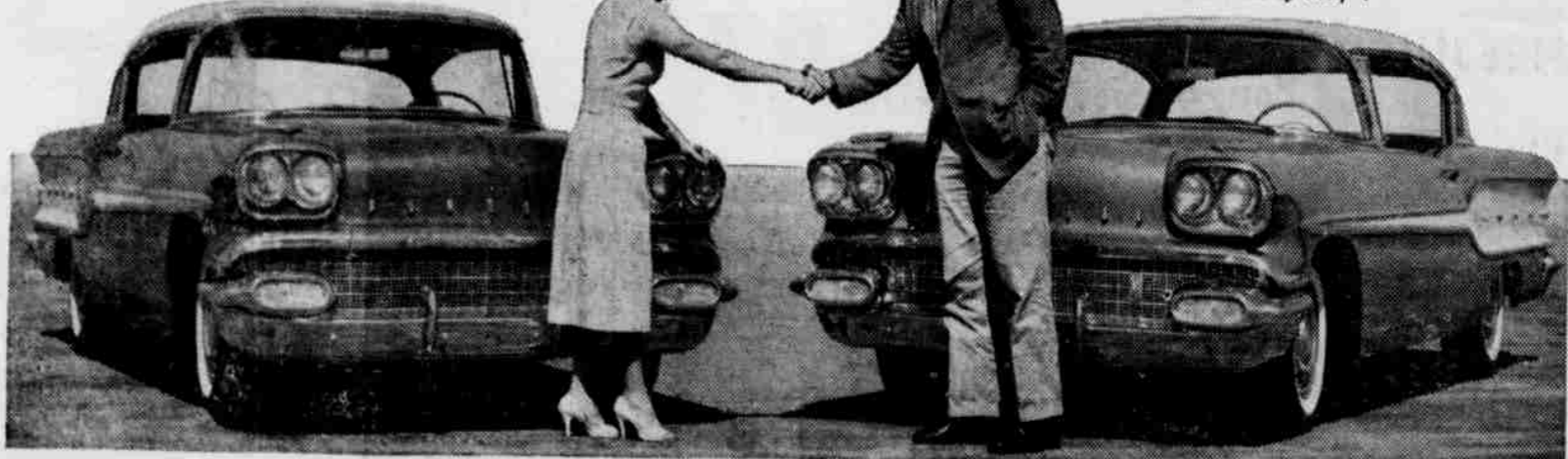
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
