County Agent News

(Continued from page 2) It has been recently announced that next year's wheat acreage allotment will be the same as this year and a referendum on marketing quotas will be held on June 20. The USDA set the nation's 1959 wheat acreage allotment at 55,000,000 acres, the minimum fixed by law. This will be the 6th straight year of wheat controls and the 5th year in a row that wheat acreage allotments have been set at the legal minimum. Growers in Oregon who will have more than 15 acres of wheat for harvest as grain in 1959 will be eligible to vote. Farmers who have signed application under the feed wheat provisions permitting them to grow wheat for use as feed on the farm will not be eligible to vote in the referendum. The USDA will announce the support price on 1959 crop wheat before the referendum date. That rate will become effective only if 2/3 of the producers voting in the referendum on June 20 approve marketing quotas. If most vote against the idea, there will be no restrictions on wheat marketing, but the support rate as of July 1, 1959 would drop to 50% of parity as required by law.

This week our office received 4 pounds of the new creeping alfalfa, Teton, developed by the South Dakota State college. This is a portion of the 15 pound al-

location made to the state of Oregon. It would be appreciated if ranches interested in growing this new variety in comparison with Rambler, Nomad and Rhyzoma would contact this office soon so that a variety trial could be established.

Morrow County Livestock Growers Association President, Bill Barratt has called a meeting of the general membership for Monday evening, April 7. It will be held at the county court room beginning at 8 pm. The meeting promises to be quite interesting since committee chairman will report on activities and recommendations which they have been considering recently. Resolutions will be adopted to go to the Oregon Cattleman's Association for action at their annual convention which will be held at Ontario on May 11, 12, 13 and 14. At the Monday evening meeting such questions as: What will be the effect of recent imports of New Zealand beef and lamb; Do we want a change in the county coyote bounty system; What are the latest contracts for calves and the effect that contract farming will have on ranchers in Morrow county—Will be some of the things discussed. All livestock producers are invited to attend.

We continue last week's discussion of Oregon seed certification standards. This week our topic will be "What are seed certification Standards". Oregon seed certification standards are nothing more than the rules which have been established to govern the actual certification of seed in the state. They indicate to the grower the things that he must do if his seed is to be eligible for certification. They also indicate to the certifying agency the points and procedures which must be checked to determine if any given

lot of seed complies with the standards and is eligible for certification. The standards themselves include a set of general certification standards which contain the rules that apply to all crops. In addition, there is a set of rules for each specific crop under certification. For example, there are specific rules for growing alfalfa seed that differ from growing certified wheat, or some variety of grass seed. Each state has its own rules and its own methods of enforcing them. In Oregon, seed certification is conducted under law by Oregon State college. Various phases of the program are directed by the Oregon State college extension service. Oregon county agents are the certification authorities in their respective counties. In general, the state certification requirements conform to the minimum certification standards as developed by the International Crop Improvement Association. In most cases, Oregon standards are superior to those adopted by the International Association.

Certification standards for different crops will change with changes in plant breeding methods, with changes in production conditions, and with changes in consumer demands. These changes may be minor in character, but some revisions are made frequently. Information on the certification of any crop in the state of Oregon and copies of the standards are available in the Morrow county agent's office.
