State Farm Prices Down During May, OSC Report Shows
 Oregon farm prices fell during May for the second consecutive month, reports Mrs Elvera Horrell, extension agricultural economist at Oregon State college. Downturns in prices paid Oregon farmers for potatoes, hay, dairy products, lambs, and food grains more than offset increases paid for feed grains, beef cattle and calves, wool, broilers, and eggs, Mrs Horrell said. As a result, prices received by the state's farmers dropped 2 percent from mid-April to mid-May, although they are still 2 percent higher than mid-May of a year ago.
 Nationally, U S department of agriculture reports show farm prices leveled off last month as lower prices on milk, potatoes, and some fresh market truck crops off-set higher prices for hogs, cattle, and cantalopes. This marked the first halt in a six-month upward trend, Mrs Horrell pointed out. The national gain over the past 12 months now adds up to 9 percent.
 Prices of things the nation's farmers buy also leveled off in May and are now 3 percent higher than in May 1957, Mrs Hor-

rell added. Higher prices for food, feeder livestock, feed, and some supply items were almost exactly offset by lower prices for clothing, building materials, seed, and household furnishings.
 With prices received by farmers over the nation holding steady during the last month, and no change in average prices paid, the purchasing power of all farm products still is 5 percent above a year ago, Mrs Horrell said. The parity ratio—the government's yardstick for measuring the relationship between prices received and prices paid by farmers—stood at 86 in May, same as last April but 4 points above May, 1957.
 U S prices on May 15 for commodities grown in Oregon, in percent of parity, were apples, 110; calves, 11; beef cattle, 99; hogs, 98; potatoes, 96; wholesale milk, 32; eggs and wheat, each 80; lambs, 79; butterfat, 76; sheep, 74; turkeys, 71; chickens, 68; oats, 67; corn, 65; barley, 64; rye, 61; and wool, 51 percent of parity.

New Grass Seeder Developed By OSC For Range Country
 Seeding of depleted western sagebrush-bunchgrass ranges is being revolutionized with a machine developed by Oregon State college agricultural experiment station.
 Tested in scattered locations of eastern Oregon range country during the past year, the new "Oregon Grass Seeder" holds promise for the following results: faster emergence of grass, two to three times more grass survival, and higher yields after grass stands are established.
 The machine will be demonstrated, June 14, at annual field day of the Squaw Butte-Harney branch experiment station 45 miles west of Burns.
 D E Booster, OSC agricultural engineer, designed the machine based on principles developed by D N Hyder and F A Sneva, range conservationists at the branch station. The station is operated jointly by the USDA agricultural research service and the OSC agricultural experiment station.
 The experimental model is an 8-row machine weighing about 1½ tons. Eight heavy wheels V-shaped furrows spaced 12 inches apart. Seed dropped behind the wheels into the pressed furrows are then covered with loose soil by drag links.
 Each wheel makes a track 6 inches wide and a seed furrow 1 inch deep. Firmness of the wheel track can be varied by adding up to 600 pounds weight per wheel in weight boxes on the frame.
 Built to stand hard treatment, the seeder has special features adapted to rough rangeland. Each presswheel is individually suspended to permit operation on rough terrain.
 Seed tubes also employ a unique feature. Close-wound coil springs are used as the lower part of the seed tube. The

Can You Identify This Object?

CLUE: In 1855 this object was instrumental in delivering a message from Charles F. Johnson of Oregon City to Thomas J. Dryer, then editor of the Oregonian.

ANSWER: The object is one of the early, crude telegraph keys used on the first telegraph line between Portland and Corvallis. The line, which ran through the mountains, was erected in 1854. The first message was sent Nov. 16, 1855, by Charles F. Johnson, chief promoter of the telegraph company, to Thomas Dryer, Oregonian editor.
