 lials, from the far sides of the country were accolated with the 1958 Good Citizen award last week.

Oregon's Senior Senator Wayne L. Morse and New York's Governor Averell Harriman were presented the award for outstanding political achievement by the International Association of Machinists.

This year's awards banquet was held at the Waldorf Astoria Hotel in New York City. Senator Morse was the principal speaker.

**NEW TRANSCONTINENTAL WAY**  
 A change in an interstate highway route designated which places Oregon on a major transcontinental interstate highway extending from Portland to the east coast has been adopted by the Route Numbering Committee of the American Society of State Highway Engineers W C Williams, announced Friday.

Original plans for the nationwide freeway system being developed under the Federal Aid Highway Act provided that Highway US 30 would become Interstate Route 82 from Portland to near Salt Lake City, where it connected with Interstate Route 80. Under the new designation Interstate Route 80 will divide at Echo Junction Utah, 40 miles northeast of Salt Lake City and become Interstate Route 80N to Portland. The southerly terminus will be San Francisco.

East from Salt Lake, Interstate Highway extends through Cheyenne, Omaha, Cleveland and Pittsburg; then splits again with a northern terminus at Elizabeth, N J, and southern terminus at Philadelphia.

The State Highway Commission, The Portland Chamber of Commerce and the Oregon Congressional delegation all urged linking the northwest with the transcontinental system because of its importance to Oregon in commerce and tourist promotion.

**THORNTON ON ARMY DUTY**  
 Attorney General Robert Y Thornton left his Salem office July 6 for Washington, D C where he will take two weeks compulsory active duty training with the United States Army.

Thornton, an overseas veteran of World War II, holds a reserve training assignment as lieutenant colonel to the Pentagon. He will take special training in the army's strategic intelligence school, located in the nation's capital.

**Winter Feed Program For Cattle Brings Profits in Test**

Ranchers in the high desert range country of Eastern Oregon may be able to find new profits in wintering beef cattle, according to scientists at the Oregon State college agricultural experiment station.

Phosphorus-fertilized flood-meadow hay plus protein supplement proved the key to faster winter gains in trials last winter at the Squaw Butte-Harney branch experiment station at Burns. The station is operated jointly by the OSC agricultural experiment station and the USDA agricultural research service.

The wintering feed program is now regarded largely as a "maintenance" operation, holding steers for grass-finishing on range the next summer.

Weaner steer calves on a 132-day winter feed program gained 33 pounds more when fed phosphorus-fertilized hay than animals on unfertilized hay, reported Farris Hubbert, animal scientist at the branch station, Phosphorus fertilizer increases the white-tip clover content of flood-meadow hay, resulting in both higher crude protein and phosphorus content of the hay, he explained.

Addition of one pound of cottonseed meal daily to unfertilized hay rations produced 37 pounds more gain than unfertilized hay alone. But the big boost came from a combination of the cottonseed meal and phosphorus-fertilized hay—80 pounds more gain than with unfertilized hay during the 132-day trial. All animals received two pounds of barley daily.

Valuing steers at 25 cents a

pound, winter gains netted \$5.41 above feed costs for animals on unfertilized hay; \$10.31 for unfertilized hay plus cottonseed meal; \$14.06 for phosphorus-fertilized hay; and \$21.19 with the combination of fertilized hay and cottonseed meal, Hubbert said.

In addition to boosting clover content of the meadow hay, application of 40 pounds of phosphorus (P205) per acre increased hay yields about three-fourths of a ton per acre.

The feeding trials, however, measured only quality of hay and didn't include increased profits per acre from total hay yields. Hubbert said all animals ate the same amounts of hay. Main difference was the levels of crude protein and phosphorus available in the two types of hay.

Calves fed unfertilized hay didn't receive sufficient phosphorus to meet "recommended allowances," Hubbert explained, even though phosphorus supplement was available "free choice" in a salt and bonemeal mix.

Addition of one pound daily of cottonseed meal brought the unfertilized hay up to adequate phosphorus levels. Fertilized hay, due to clover content, met phosphorus requirements without addition of cottonseed meal.

Importance of phosphorus for range cows in the sagebrush-bunchgrass region was also reported by R R Wheeler, animal researcher at the branch station.

Phosphorus supplements available at all times in the form of bonemeal and disodium phosphate resulted in about two-weeks earlier average conception dates for range cows and a slight increase in the number of calves born, Wheeler said. Further studies are planned to see if higher levels of phosphorus supplement intake by cows may increase birth weight and weaning weight of calves.
