 ficers down to positions in the smallest municipalities.
 At this stage in past general elections both political parties have been in what could be termed a sweat. If you should ask what the voter folks are thinking about, the answer is-not politics.
 Someone will have to pull an ace from outside the deck to get things to even look like a political campaign.
GOP STRATEGY MEETING
 Responding to a call made by Secretary of State Mark Hatfield about 150 persons, including 60 Republican candidates, met at Salem's American Legion Hall Saturday afternoon and heard the Republican candidate for governor outline his position on the more important campaign issues. Secretary Hatfield emphasized that he was speaking only for their information and not trying to dictate what their positions should be. Almost half the 100 men were legislators or recent members of the Legislature.
 Reports were made on recent activities of several legislative committees.
 The meeting ended with district sessions on local problems.
 Some 50 women attended a separate meeting in the hall for wives of candidates.
SECRET VOTE ON STRIKE
 A suggestion that both sides in the construction strike deadlock in Portland should consider a secret ballot vote on an armistice was made early this week by Secretary of State Mark Hatfield.
 Hatfield said he was making the suggestion, "as a friendly neutral interested in the well being of the many families of our state affected by the work delay."
 Should the men vote for an armistice by secret ballot, Hatfield pointed out, work could be resumed and upward payroll adjustments could be made later depending upon negotiations.
STATE JOBS SCARCE
 Charles Terry, director of the State Civil Service Commission said Thursday there is no shortage of help in state activities other than the State Highway Department and in a few technical offices at the present time, however there are a few positions for which the Civil Service is requesting applicants to take tests. They are for key punch supervisor positions which pay

from \$295 to \$360 a month, in Salem with the Industrial Accident Commission, Unemployment Compensation Commission, Tax Commission, Public Utilities Commission, Highway Commission, and Department of Finance and Administration, in Portland; with the State Welfare Commission; in Corvallis and with the Department of Higher Education.
 Applications should be filed with the Oregon State Civil Service Commission 102 Public Service Building, Salem or 304 State Office Bldg., Portland.
A GREATER STATE FAIR
 The joys of camping at the Oregon State Fair have made a cycle of nearly 100 years, beginning with the days of the covered wagon drawn by oxen to the present \$50,000 two-family trailer mansions, with swimming pools.
 A new trailer park in the oak grove near the Livestock Building will be one of the new features at the Greater Oregon State Fair. A new sewer line has been laid and there will be water and electric connection for 70 trailer houses. These spaces will be rented at \$1 a day to concessionaires and exhibitors.
 Another new feature is the relocation of the picnic grounds in the shady grove on the west end of the Fairgrounds, near the main line of the Southern Pacific. This was the location of the main entrance in years past when most fairgoers arrived by busses, streetcars or railroad. A new sprinkling system, a new lighting system and drinking fountains have been installed with the many tables, benches and fireplaces for cooking, all enclosed by cyclone fences to make it safe for children, a "must" idea of fair board chairman Marguerite E Berg.
LOOKOUT FOR SLICK FLOORS
 The Oregon Supreme Court ruled Friday that waxing a floor is not negligence.
 In reversing a judgement which awarded \$12,217 to a woman who slipped at an Oregon City hospital while visiting her husband, the court ruled that in this case evidence failed to show any lack of due care in the method used in waxing.
