BUDGET POST EXCHANGE
 New plans for state finance department practices now being set up by Director John Richardson include changes in Personnel and procedures which he considers long out-dated.
 Tuesday, Director Richardson selected a state executive and accountant with 11 year experience to head the budget division succeeding LaVerne Young. The seasoned executive, William E Bass, has been director of management research since January. He entered state civil service in 1947, worked in the division of audits and served as comptroller of State Tax Commission. A graduate of University of Mississippi and has a master's degree from University of Oregon.
 In finance department Richardson's four principal lieutenants are the heads of budget, management research, purchasing and services. All are appointive positions outside civil service with pay between \$750 and \$850 a month.
 Richardson said he will supervise the management research division himself until he finds a suitable replacement for Bass.
VITAL STATISTICS
 All types of Oregon vital events except infant deaths during the first half of 1958 dropped below comparable 1957 levels, according to tabulations of State Board of Health Vital Statistics section.
 For the first time in recent years U S births did not show an increase over a similar period. Following the national trend Oregon's 17,722 births were the fewest since 1950, deaths and marriages decreased to the lowest mark since 1954, and the number of divorces was the smallest since the early 1940's.
 The total number of deaths declined less than one percent during the six month period.
 Accidental deaths reported in Oregon during the first half of 1958, numbered 468, compared

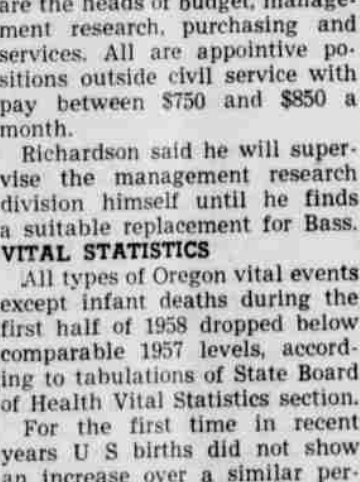

 are most noticeably affected, and when heavily infested do not gain normally. Sheep ticks can be controlled by spraying, dipping or dusting. Lindane, Toxophene and DDT are recommended as dips or sprays. Follow the manufacturer's directions in preparing the spray or dip solution. One of the simplest and cheapest methods of control—particularly for the small, farm flock—is dusting with 1 1/2 Dieldrin. About 10 or 15 sheep may be placed in a small pen approximately 12 to 14 feet square and then dusted thoroughly using a rotary type hand duster. Avoid overcrowding animals and dust a few head at a time to get a uniform coverage. About 2 ounces of dust per head is usually sufficient. Many of our range sheep men with large bands have found power dusting to be quick and simple. Do not apply dust within 90 days of slaughter or do not dip or spray within 30 days of slaughter. The little time and few cents per head spent for sheep tick control will more than repay the owner within increased profits. The Van Scholacks figure that it costs them approximately 2 cents per mature animal to treat.

HOTTEST STATE FAIR

Many records of attendance were broken at the Oregon State Fair's first ten-day show. The pari mutuel races handled more than a million dollars for the first time in the fair's history. The Horse Show-Rodeo beat out the Nite Review 'tho both beat former records. General attendance admission tickets duplicated 1957. The attendance at all attractions was much heavier than 1957.

Before the 1958 fair closed Saturday night the State Fair Board and Manager Howard Maple were unanimous in signing the 1958 stage show, horse show, rodeo and carnival attractions for next year's fair.

Permission to allow smoking in the last three seats of buses was presented to Public Utilities Commissioner Howard Morgan this week, who said he would soon announce a date for a public hearing on the request.
 Smoking in buses has been prohibited for the past 18 years.

OTI TOLD TO ADMIT ALL

Any student who can meet the admission requirements of Oregon Technical Institute must be admitted, Attorney General Robert Y Thornton ruled this week.
 Winston Purvine, OTI director, said this will mean that OTI, located at Klamath Falls, will have to exceed the 100-student maximum that had been decreed by the legislature.

He told the State Board of Education, which runs OTI, that the enrollment this fall probably will be about 1,075 as the result of Thornton's opinion. He said there are now 1,193 applications for enrollment, but that more than 100 probably won't show up for school. There is a pressing need for physical repairs but the budget can maintain the campus at a minimum level through the year.
