Herb Copeland and Nancy Healy of Salem spent the weekend at the Stanley Boyer home while here hunting.

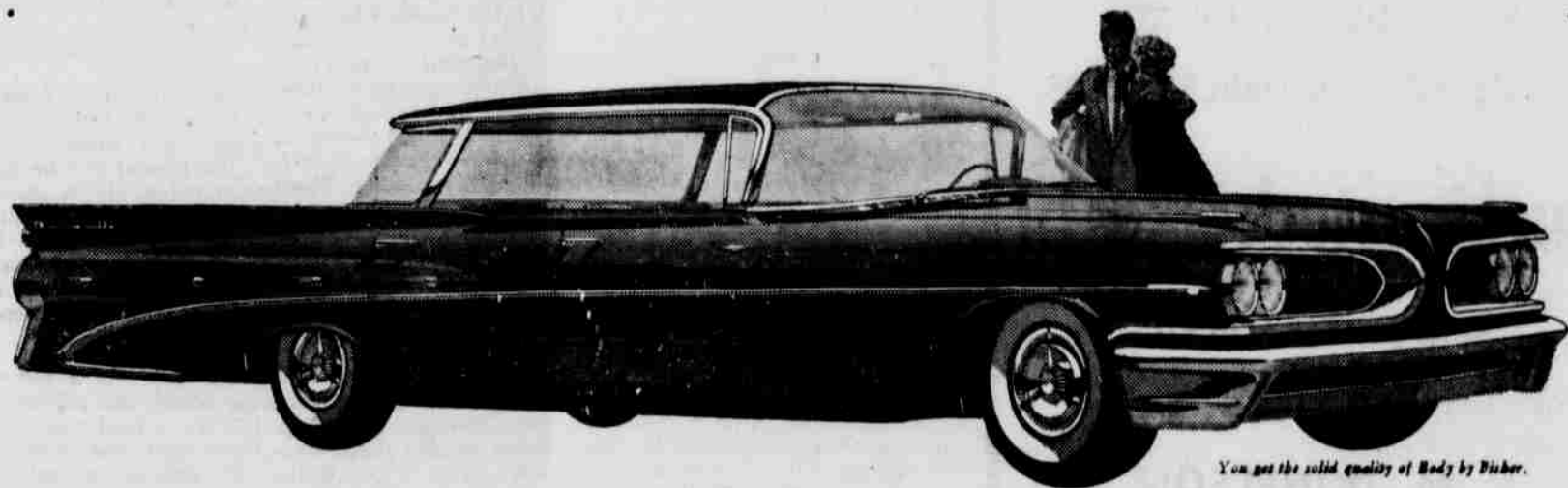

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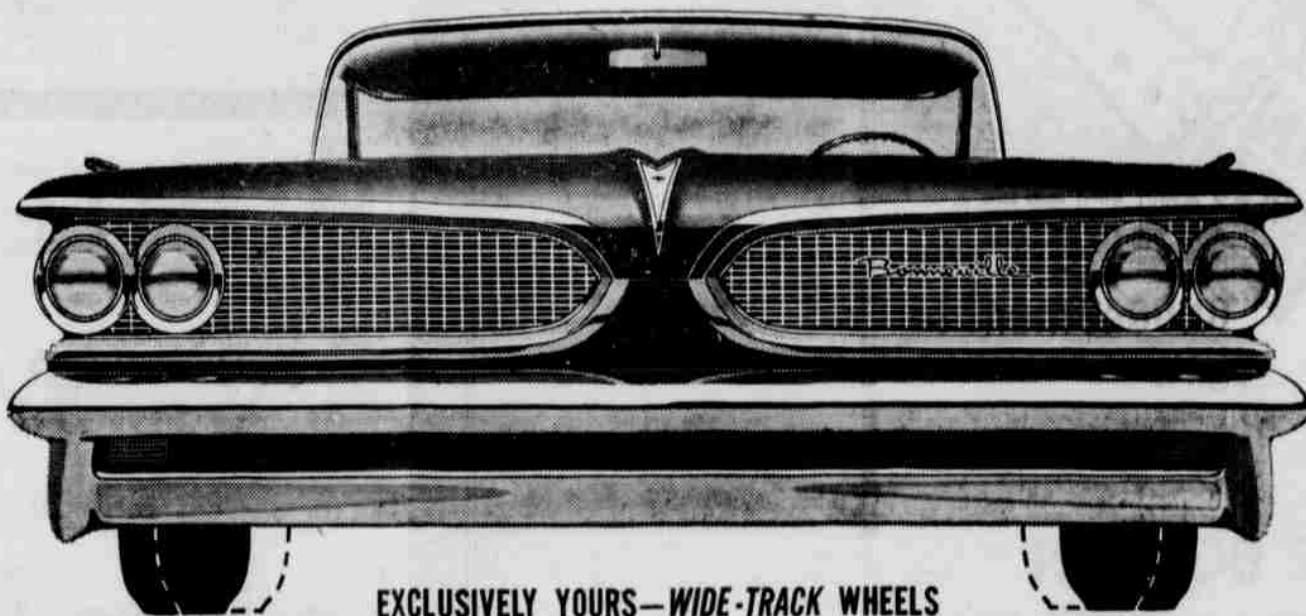

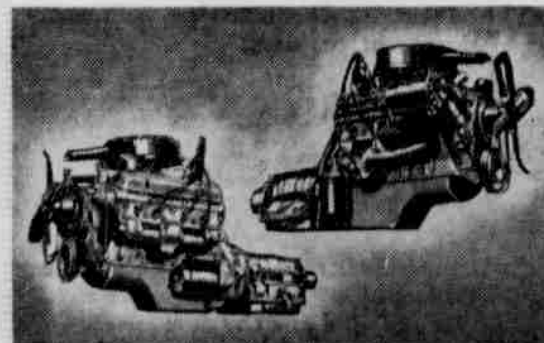
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
