

HERE ARE THE RULES OF THIS CHRISTMAS FUN GAME!

1.—Check the front page of your Heppner Gazette Times for the special number which appears in the upper right hand corner of the page. Each copy of the Gazette Times will bear a special number like this each week from now to December 18.

2.—Compare the number on your copy of the Gazette Times with the number on the poster in the stores of each of the 21 participating Heppner merchants. The numbers on these posters are the lucky numbers which will be different each week.
