State Traffic Death Rate Shows Decline

Oregon's accumulative traffic death rate for ten months this year has dropped below the rate for the same period last year, according to the Department of Motor Vehicles.

The death rate of 5.7, based upon the number of deaths per one hundred million miles driven, is three-tenths of a point below the 6.0 for 1957.

The department added that unless the mileage driven in November this year dropped significantly, the reduction in fatalities last month should mean an even more improved death rate. In 1957, the November death rate was 10.9. Traditionally, the last two months of the year are high death rate periods. Heavy travel during holidays and increased hazards of darkness and pedestrian activity are considered primary causes of the early winter jump.

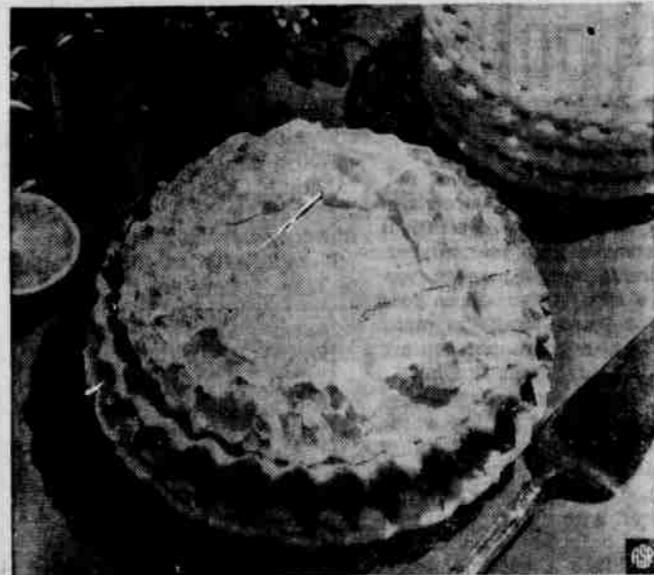

Beat egg yolks in top of double boiler; add Florida orange juice concentrate and salt. Cook over hot water, stirring constantly, until thickened. Remove from heat. Beat egg whites until stiff; gradually beat in sugar. Fold half the meringue into orange mixture; turn into pie shell. Pipe remaining meringue around edge of pie. Bake in a hot oven (425° F.) 8 minutes or until lightly browned.
YIELD: 1 9-inch pie.
