Marketing Functions, Farmer Hints Listed In New OSC Bulletin

How do farm foods move to family tables? This is one of the questions answered in a new bulletin published by the Oregon State College extension service, Titled, "What is Marketing?" the new publication points out that marketing does two things. First, it moves a product from the person who produces it to the person who uses it. And, second, it returns money through marketing channels to the producer.
 This makes it possible for farmers and other producers to exchange the products they raise or manufacture for items such as clothing, furniture, or machinery produced by others. Without marketing, it would be difficult for anyone to get the items in everyday living, it is explained.
 "A glance at the people over the earth shows that producers who have good markets for exchanging their produce have the high levels of living, while people who do not have markets live the subsistence type of life," the bulletin states.
 What marketing is, and how it is done, is clearly explained through illustrations. Each of the nine marketing functions—selling, transportation, standards and grading, financing, market information, storage, risk-taking, processing and packaging, and buying—are described in simple language.
 Role of housewives in helping set prices is also explained in the new publication. There are also hints on ways farmers may be able to save some of the cost of marketing their products.
 The bulletin was written by Harold F Hollands and Marlon D Thomas, agricultural economists at OSC. Oregon residents can get a copy from their county extension office, or from the OSC bulletin clerk, Corvallis.
