Don Turner Takes Over Ranch Operation

Don Turner, Portland insurance man, and his wife Janet have moved to Morrow county where he will operate his father's 1300 acre wheat ranch ten miles North of Heppner. With the exception of 80 acres acquired last year, the ranch has been in the Turner family since 1898, when R W Turner, who homesteaded the Turner ranches in the Sand Hollow area 15 years earlier, purchased it from John Piper. J O Turner bought the ranch in 1916, and farmed it 10 years before going into the law.

Turner was born in Heppner, spent his early years on this same ranch, graduated from Heppner high school in 1937, and the University of Oregon in 1941. After serving in World War II he was an officer in the First National Bank of Portland before entering the insurance business in 1953. Associated with the L J Evans General Agency in Portland and representing the century-old Northwestern Mutual Life Insurance Company of Milwaukee, Wisconsin, Turner first qualified for the Million Dollar Round Table in 1953, and specializing in estate planning won the Northwestern's annual Western regional sales contests in 1954, 1955, 1956, and 1957. He will maintain his Portland office and continue to service and sell life, health and accident insurance, and annuities throughout Oregon.

The Turners have a daughter, Virginia Lou, and a son, Jeffrey, both now attending Heppner grade school.

Ernest Heliker and Ed Buschke were Hermiston visitors Monday. Mrs Cleo Drake has been ill at her home.

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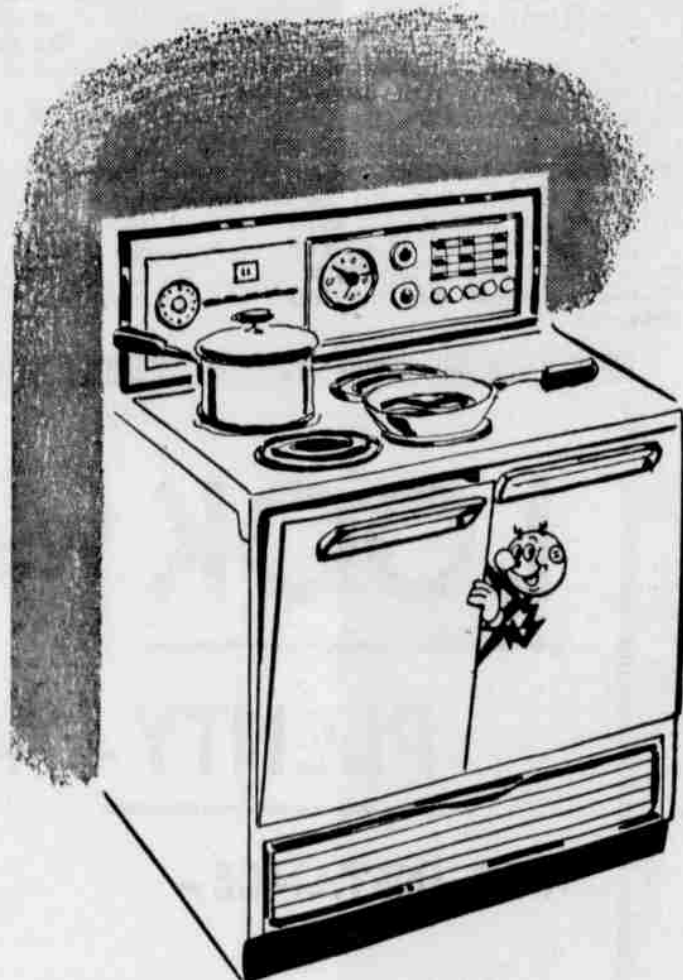
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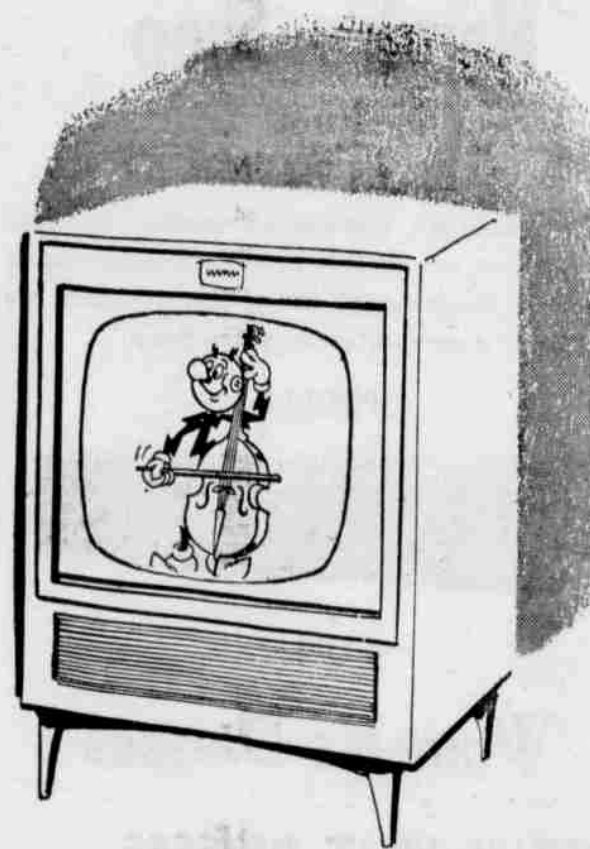
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
