Oregon Ballots Give Support To Strong U N

A strengthened United Nations through which the U S can base relations with foreign governments has received strong support from Oregon "Great Decisions" discussion group.

Opinion ballots from persons participating in informal discussion groups in 22 Oregon counties were tabulated this week by the Oregon State College extension service. Discussion topic was "What Kind of World is Possible?"

Many of those voting favored working toward some form of world government.

Greater mutual understanding between U S and foreign peoples and institutions topped factors listed as vital to U S national interests in today's world.

Continued healthy growth of the U S economy, continued access to raw materials and markets of the world, expansion of world trade, faster economic growth in the underdeveloped world and closer economic, political and cultural relations with our industrialized, democratic allies also were rated as important policy considerations.

Military power sufficient to discourage aggression received a third more votes than did military power sufficient to wage any kind of war.

Voters ranked 22 U S policy proposals now being debated in Washington, giving top priorities in the following order:

Work for strengthening of the U N. Provide the kind of U S assistance (where it is wanted) that will help colonial peoples build stable economic, political and social institutions.

OSC Studies Ways To Increase Feed Value of Barley

Possibilities of increasing the feed value of barley with the use of special malt products are under study at Oregon State college.

Dr J E Oldfield, animal husbandman in charge of the project, says the malt enzymes may help break down the fibrous grains and speed digestion. They show some promise in tests to date of increasing gains of pigs on a barley ration, he said.

It is known that barley and other fibrous grains, although apparently well-suited as animal feeds according to chemical analysis, do not produce as rapid rates of growth as corn and other non-fibrous grains, Oldfield explained.

The OSC research with enzyme additives and work elsewhere on soaking and drying of the grain prior to feeding as a means of stimulating natural enzyme activity within the kernel are part of a broad program aimed at enhancing the feed value of barley.

Big supplies of barley in the Northwest make the research of major economic importance, Oldfield explained.

Lee Larsen a graduate student from Reseda, California is conducting the animal feeding experiments involved in this study.
