UPON QUESTION OF INCREASING TAX LEVY OVER AMOUNT LIMITED BY SECTION 11, ARTICLE XI, STATE CONSTITUTION.

Notice is hereby given that an election will be held in the designated school sub-districts 10, 25, 35c, 40, 1c, and 12, of Morrow County, State of Oregon, on June 29, 1959. The election will be held from 2:00 P. M. on the above date, being Monday, June 29, 1959, A. D. Such elections will be held in the school houses in each of the said component sub-districts. The purpose of submitting to the legal voters of said sub-districts, the question of increasing the tax levy for the fiscal year 1959-1960 over the amount limited by Section 11, Article XI, of the Constitution of Oregon.

The reasons for increasing such levy are: 1. The low tax base, due to the fact that some districts lost their base entirely and others could only be increased by the legal allowed 6% per year. 2. Increased costs in maintaining buildings and making needed repairs. 3. Increases in teaching and administrative salaries. 4. High cost of supplies and equipment and repairs to some of our older buildings. 5. Amount allowed for purchase of school property.

The total base of all sub-districts in the Morrow County School District (operating under the County Unit Plan) is \$173,118.61.

The amount of tax, in excess of the 6% limitation, proposed to be levied for the said fiscal year (1959-60) is \$445,286.18.
