May Farm Prices Mix Ups and Downs

Oregon farm prices were a mixture of ups and downs in May but averaged 1 percent above May 1958, reports Mrs Elvira Horrell, Oregon State College extension agricultural economist.

In contrast to the Oregon trend, national farm prices are still 4 percent below a year ago.

Prices in Oregon for poultry and dairy products continued to slip. Hogs, calves, and hay prices were also lower. On the up-trend, however, were prices for potatoes, wheat, corn, beef cattle, lambs, and wool, the economist noted.

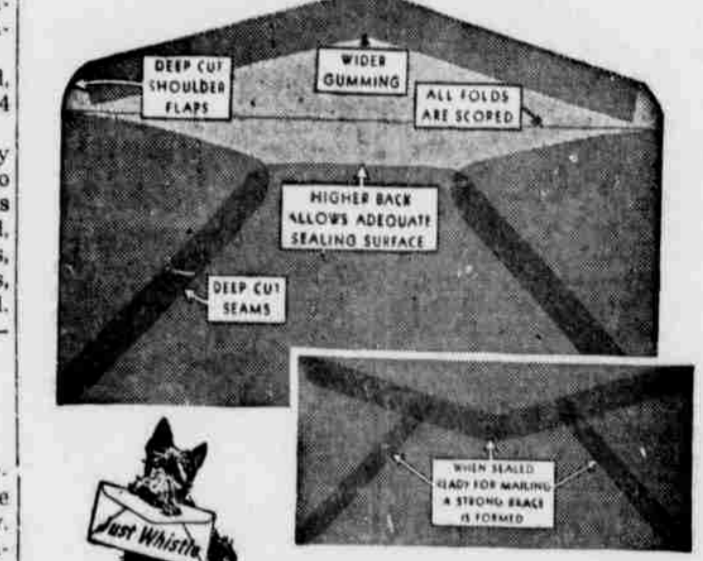
