"Mike" Cloyd Ransom Hutchison was born July 22, 1920 at Malta, Idaho, the son of Estall Ransom and David Wheeler Hutchison.

He was a member of the L D S church. Mike served in World War II seeing active service in Luzon and he received five different medals during his service. On his return home he met and married June Whitaker at her home in Elba, Idaho on October 24, 1946.

They moved to Monument March 1953 where he has worked for the Columbia Power Co-op ever since.

He was accidentally killed Wednesday noon, July 15 near Monument while stringing wire to improve television service for the community.

His survivors are his wife, June; two daughters, Diane and Lynn; two sons, Forrest and Sheldon and a son, David Wayne, preceded him in death; his parents, Mr and Mrs D W Hutchison; two sisters, Mrs Alora Tynes and Velda Barrett; one brother, E Udell Hutchison.
