NO FUNDS TO RICHMOND
The state treasurer cannot legally place state funds in the hands of a Richmond Va. federal reserve bank, Attorney General Robert Y Thornton said Monday. The question came up because the State Board of Higher Education seeks financing by the Federal Housing and Home Finance Agency at Oregon Colleges of Education.

The agency has agreed to buy Oregon Higher Education Building bonds and asked that the state treasurer appoint the Richmond bank as their fiscal agent for collection of interest and principal payments on the bond issue.

However state law specifically provides that those payments on State Board of Higher Education bonds shall be made at the office of the state treasurer or a properly-designated fiscal agent in New York City, Thornton said.

STATE ITEMS
A "first cover" (that's an envelope in stamp collectors phantasy) one of the few in mail that was fired by missile from a submarine off the Florida coast and is already a collector's item, has been received by the State Library. It was presented to the library by Sen. Richard L. Neuberger who had received it from the postmaster general.

NAMED BY GOV HATFIELD
Frank McKennon, appointed early this year by Gov Mark Hatfield as director of the State Department of Agriculture has been named as chairman of the Inter-agency Committee on Migratory Labor. The committee was created by the 1959 Legislature.
