Fruited Lime Ring

Combine 2 envelopes plain gelatin, 2 teaspoons grated lime rind and ¼ cup fresh lime juice and let stand until gelatin is softened. Dissolve in 2 cups hot water. Stir in ¼ teaspoon salt and ½ cup sugar. Drain a No. 2½ can fruit cocktail, saving syrup; stir 1 cup syrup into gelatin. Cool until slightly thickened. Fold in well drained fruit cocktail, and 1 (3-ounce) package cream cheese, cut into tiny cubes. Chill until firm in 8½-inch ring mold. Unmold onto crisp salad greens, and fill center of ring with fresh fruits. Makes about 8 servings.
