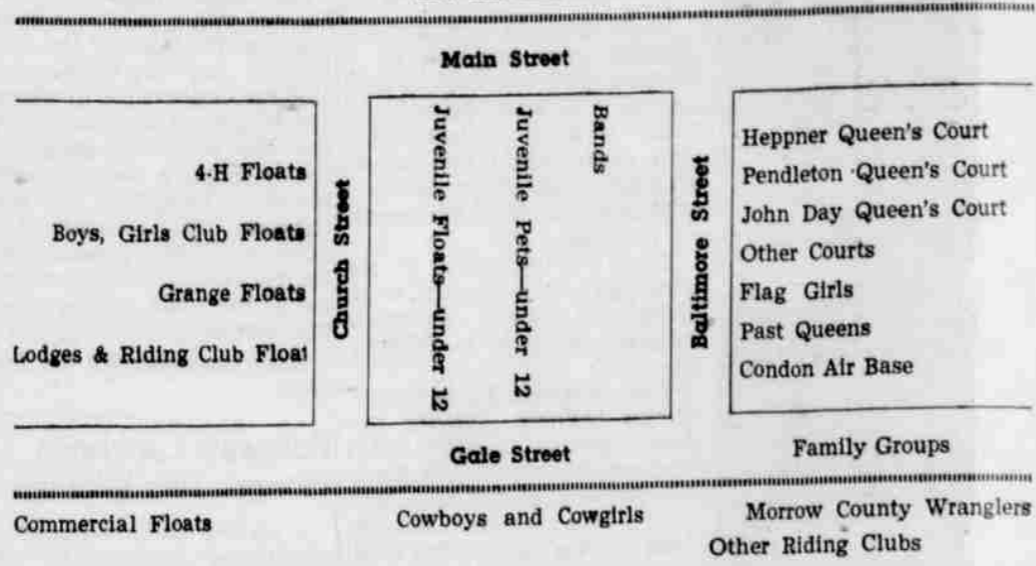
Communities represented in the Trail Riding were Ione, Arlington, Condon, Olex and Mikkalo.

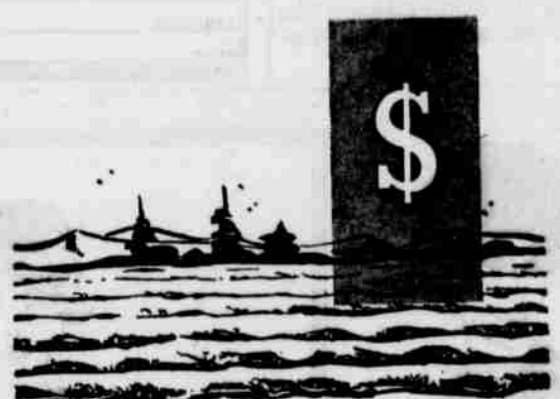
