Mr and Mrs C L Lieuallen of Pendleton spent the weekend at the home of their daughter and family, Mr and Mrs Robert Jepsen.

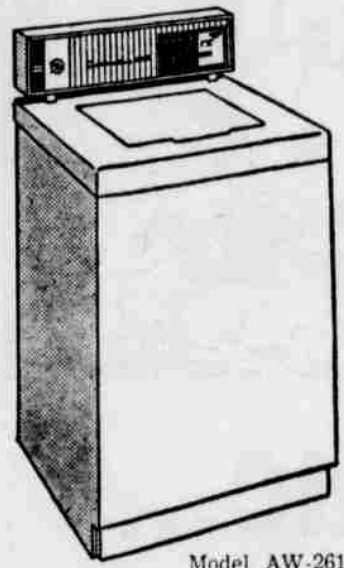

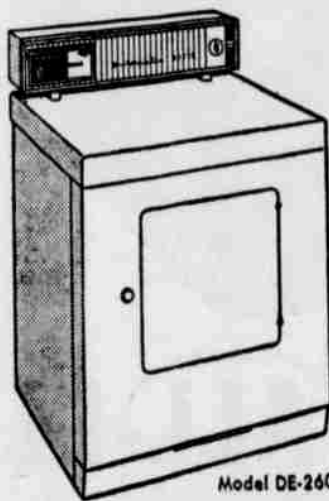
