Sheep, Wool Days Program Slated Nov 13-14 at OSC
Production and marketing discussions will highlight the state's first Sheep and Wool Days program at Oregon State College, Nov 13 and 14, according to Dr D C Church, animal husbandman at the OSC agricultural experiment station.
Participants will view research being done at OSC on lamb feeding and Hampshire breeding. Various methods of evaluating grades of wool, staple lengths, shrinkages and grease prices per pound will be demonstrated.
The first day's program will feature a talk by G Alvin Carpenter, livestock marketing specialist at the University of Calif-

OSC Tests Indicate Big Gains in Oregon High School English
OREGON STATE COLLEGE—English instruction in Oregon high schools has made marked gains in the past six years, the head of the Oregon State College English department believes, and he cites comparative test scores by new freshmen to back up his opinion.
Each fall, new OSC freshmen are given an English placement test to help determine for which classes they are best prepared, Dr Herbert B Nelson explains.
This year the same placement test was given that was given in 1953. It covered grammatical errors, capitalization, punctuation, and spelling. Improvement was noted in all areas.
Scores this fall averaged from 10 to 15 percent better than those of six years ago.

AGRICULTURAL CENSUS
The 1959 agricultural census enumerators start Nov 4 and will be completed within three to seven weeks depending on several conditions, the size of the county being "worked," the aptitude of enumerators and responsiveness of the populace.
The accuracy of the report will depend on the preliminary work land owners do prior to enumerator's arrival.
Typical inquiries will be about the acres of land owned, rented, shared or rented for cash and whether the land is mortgaged.
Questions also will be asked about the cost of gas and oil used in 1959, hired labor and machine labor used and the dollar value of livestock and feed purchased.

BOYS SCHOOL LEADERS
Oregon's MacLaren School for Boys was the host's spot for a two-day session of western training school superintendents which drew 28 delegates from 15 states and provinces this week. Allen F Breed, superintendent of California's Fricot Ranch School, said his state is concentrating on work with smaller groups, in more homelike situations such as will be possible in MacLaren's new grouped cottages.
Breed urged the teachers to keep on the move in developing new and better programs. "Even if you are on the right track," he stressed, "if you just sit there you'll just get run over."
Elected president was the man who came the furthest west, H L Miles of the Iowa training school at Eldora.

SAVINGS BOND BUYING
While the Congress was making changes in U S Savings Bonds by boosting interest Wall Street warned there would be at least a brief buying pause—and possibly a dip in other bonds.
Evidently Oregonians have more confidence in the U S than in the little street of Fate. They kept right on buying, according to State Director George W Minnaugh who reports that eight Oregon counties broke their records for the month, with Harney County leading with an increase of over 60 percent. Others making heavy increases were, Clackamas, Columbia, Crook, Curry, Malheur, Wallowa and Wheeler.

DISCARD PAY PLAN
More than 600 elementary school principals in their fall conference refused to back reports that favored state laws for minimum salary and tenure for principals. The chief reason expressed was, "... we do not want to be asking special favors for ourselves."
The convention, held at Salem's Marion Motor Hotel, did endorse state support of public school kindergartens and also favored retaining present administrative credentials for elementary principals.
