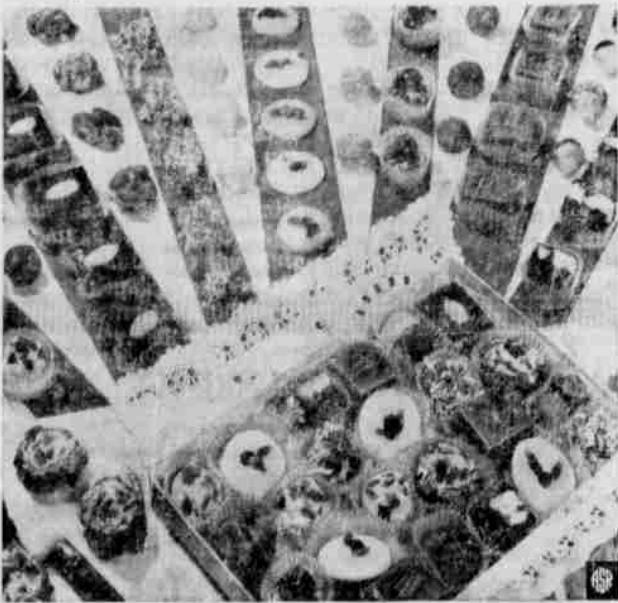


Simplest Sweets This Side of Heaven



Holiday candies can be as much fun to make as they are to eat—and almost as fast.

Evaporated milk combined with confectioner's sugar is one of the quickest candies going. Flavor it, color it, shape it, decorate it any way you like. Children especially love making this no-cook fondant. Use 1/2 cup evaporated milk to 2 pounds sifted confectioner's sugar. This mixture is good with nuts, chocolate, peppermint, coconut or candied fruits.

For crystalline candies like fudge and peneche, the higher whole milk solids content of evaporated milk helps prevent the formation of "sugary" crystals. This gives an exceptionally smooth, creamy texture to your festive candies. Here's a fudge recipe that should win you a kiss even without mistletoe:

Chocolate Mallow Fudge

1 cup evaporated milk	1 1/2 cups miniature marshmallows
2 cups sugar	1 teaspoon vanilla
2 6-ounce packages (1 cup each) semi-sweet chocolate pieces	

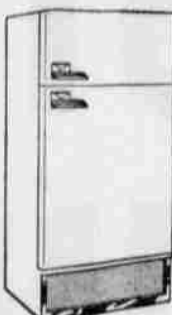
Combine evaporated milk and sugar in saucepan. Place over low heat and stir until sugar is dissolved and mixture comes to a boil. Increase heat and boil 2 minutes, stirring constantly. Remove from heat, add semi-sweet chocolate pieces and vanilla and stir until smooth. Turn approximately 1/2 of the chocolate mixture into waxed paper-lined 8-inch square pan. Cover with miniature marshmallows, pressing marshmallows gently into chocolate. Top with remaining chocolate mixture. Chill and cut into squares. Yield: Approximately 2 pounds.
