Liquor Stores Set Early Closing Hours

Hugh R Kirkpatrick, chairman of the Oregon liquor control commission, announced Wednesday that all state stores and agencies will close at 6:00 p. m. December 24 and December 31. The early closing time for Christmas eve and New Year's eve was established two years ago in compliance with requests from community leaders throughout the state.

The commission also announced at its monthly meeting that specially wrapped packages and decanter bottles of distilled spirits went on public sale Monday, November 16. Many brands are

available in attractive holiday packages at regular prices in state stores and agencies.

V G Van Bergen, administrator, reported that of approximately 6,000 license renewal applications mailed in October, about 1500 have been received and are being processed. Careful consideration is given to each application to insure that all premises are complying with the statutes, with special attention being given to sanitation. A number of licensees have been warned that deficiencies must be remedied or their privileges will not be extended past December 31. Van Bergen also stated that licensees should return their ap-

plications to the commission by December 15 to be sure of receiving their licenses before January 1.

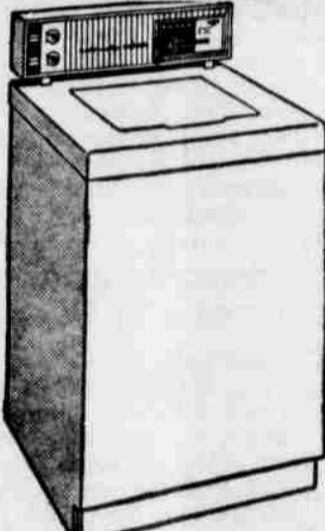
