New Law Changes System of State School Scholarships

Students nominated for state-paid scholarships by members of the legislature before the repeal of the old free-scholarship law must re-apply to the new State Scholarship Commission if they have not already been selected by their county court, according to an opinion Attorney General Robert Y Thornton released today.

Representative Frank Weatherford requested the opinion because he had nominated a Fossil high school senior for a free scholarship to Oregon State College before passage of the new law, and wanted to know if the boy was still eligible.

The new law (SB 133) became effective in May. It created a State Scholarship Commission which can award one scholarship for each seat in the Legislature and one for each county in the state. Under the old law, qualified students were nominated by legislators and then selected by lot by their county court.

Since the boy in question only had been "nominated" by Representative Weatherford but apparently had not yet been selected by the county court, Thornton held that he technically had not "received" a scholarship under provisions of the old law, and that he should therefore make application to the State Scholarship Commission as prescribed by Chapter 564, Oregon Laws 1959, in order to get the scholarship.

If he had actually received a scholarship under the old law he would continue to receive it, since the new law provides that students who got scholarships before the effective date of the new law would be able to continue their educations under the old provisions.
