Marlene Griffin Has Saturday Party

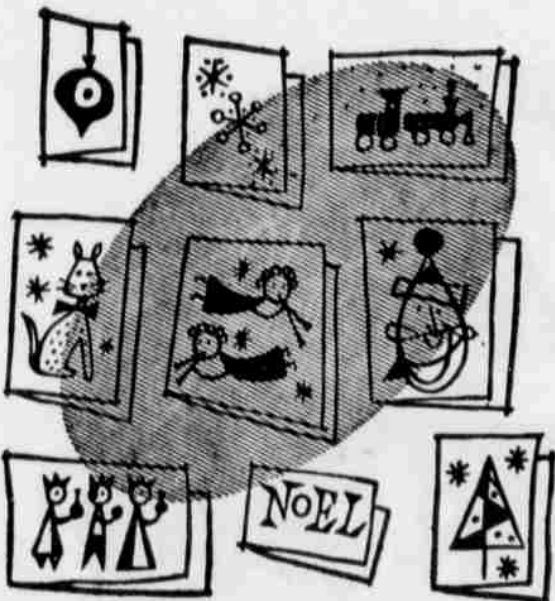
Marlene Griffin entertained with a dancing party Saturday evening at the home of her mother, Mrs Jessie Griffin.
