SHERER-BARTALAMAY VOWS READ AT ODESSA LUTHERAN CHURCH

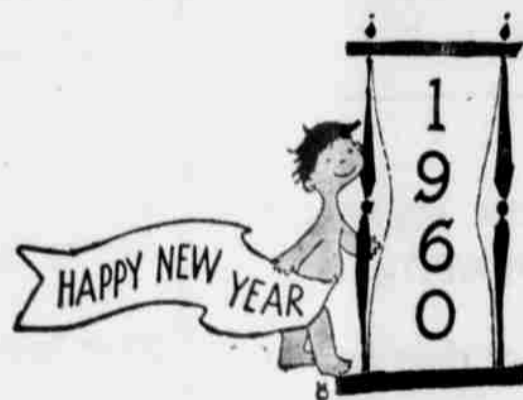
