How do you rate as a grandmother? One hundred college girls at the University of Nebraska said they appreciated a grandmother who keeps up with the times and adjusts to changing customs. The grandmother who is independent and has a life of her own is more appreciated than the one who centers her entire life and interests around her children.

Although they want a grandmother youthful in thinking, girls said they want her to dress and act her age. Grandmothers who keep the larger family together are liked, but the one who tries to "run everything" is not appreciated. Girls like the grandmother who renders loving service and who does not criticize the way parents bring up children.

Granddaughters who talk to grandmother about their problems want the freedom to make their own decisions.

A third of the girls in the study mentioned the importance of grandmothers being impartial and not showing favorites among the grandchildren.

Outstanding personality trait mentioned was consideration for others. Friendliness and cheerfulness was frequently mentioned. What youth liked about grandmothers is similar to what others like about person at all ages.

Young "Beanpoles" Sprout Earlier

Children are growing up earlier today than in the past. Why? Are we adults encouraging them to take on activities at an earlier age?

Perhaps one answer is in the physiological development of young people. Average age at menarche (menstruation) for girls in 1850 was 16 or 17 years of age. One hundred years later in 1950 average age was 12.5 to 13. Perhaps this factor, as well as changing conditions in society, helps to explain the interest in dating which starts earlier today than formerly.

American boys today are 6 to 8" taller and 12 to 15% heavier than those 50 years ago. Boys are growing taller earlier in life. It is estimated that adult height was not attained until about age 26 half a century ago. Today it is reached at about age 18 for boys and age 16 for girls. Babies are walking at an earlier age. In 1938 only 25% of the children were walking by one year of age. Twenty years later in 1958, about 60% were walking at this age.
