County 4-H Club Members Picked For Salem Meet

Fifty-nine teenagers representing Oregon's 31,000 4-H club members will gather in Salem, Feb. 4, 5 and 6 for a first-hand study of state government.

Theme of the 4-H club conference is "Know Your State Government." The program was organized three years ago by Oregon State College extension service.

Delegates will meet Friday morning in the house of representatives to hear representatives of the executive and legislative branches. Howell Apple, secretary of state, will welcome the delegates and discuss the executive branch of government.

House Speaker Robert Duncan of Medford and Senate President Walter Pearson, Portland, will describe the function of the lawmaking bodies in shaping government action.

The 4-H conference is really a "work" session, says Burton Hutton, state 4-H extension leader. During the conference, young citizens will visit with six department representatives and take part in informal questioning. The 4-H group will visit the departments of finance and administration, agriculture, forestry, highway, motor vehicles and state police.

Charles A. Sprague, Salem, publisher of the Oregon Statesman and former governor, will address the group Friday night.

Saturday, the 4-H's will meet with Howard Belton, state treasurer, and visit the Supreme Court library. Chief Justice William McAllister will be host.

That noon, four of the 4-H's will be selected for expense-paid trips to the National 4-H Club Conference in Washington, D C in April. They will be picked by personal interviews on the basis of leadership shown through 4-H records, school, church, and community; high school scholarship; and their willingness to share their skills with younger club members. Chosen from Morrow county to attend are Mardine Baker and Kenneth Smouse of Ione.

U of O Sets Dad's Day February 19-20

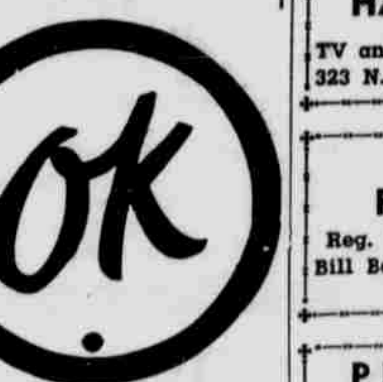
UNIVERSITY OF OREGON—Dad's Day on the University of Oregon campus will be held February 19-20.
