It was interesting to note the variance in the amount of precipitation from the snowfall occurring during the month of January. Louis Carlson, with an official U S Weather Bureau station in the Gooseberry community, reports 1.55 inches precipitation for January. Mike Matthews in the southwest Ione area, squeezed a 1.45 inches out of the snow received there. Raymond Lundell, a little south of both of these stations, measured 1.39. Don Heliker, in the west Ione area had 1.12. Precipitation at the Harry Proudfoot farm on Butter creek was .73. Regardless of the amounts, everyone was happy to get whatever they measured and all are looking forward to more moisture in either forms of rain or snow. We are happy to have a number of new cooperators reporting rainfall records which keeps us posted on prospects for crop in each of the communities.

Don Robinson, of Kirk and Robinson Polled Hereford Ranch, Heppner, was in the office the other day to report some bull sales coming up. He reported that Barnett Hereford Ranch, Boardman, would have six bulls; Gerald Bergstrom, Heppner, two bulls; and their ranch, two bulls and one heifer consigned to the Oregon Polled Hereford sale to be held at Redmond on Saturday, February 13. The show will be held at 9:00 A. M.; the sale at 12:30 p. m. The sale will be at the Armory; the show at the fairgrounds. Upon returning from this sale, he will have two horned bulls consigned in a pen to the Blue Tag Sale which will be held at Pendleton on February 18. He reports these two bulls as being excellent sires for someone who could use a pair of good bulls.

For the third consecutive month no individual commodities showed up on the "above parity" monthly list of selected farm commodities. January prices in percent of parity ranged from a high of 97% of parity on oranges to a low of 57% of parity on both hogs and wool. Other U S farm prices in percent of parity on commodities of interest to Oregon growers were: calves, 92%; potatoes, 90%; beef cattle and apples, each 86% wholesale milk, 83%; oats, 82%; turkeys and butterfat, each 81%; wheat, 75%; lambs, 70%; barley, 67%; eggs and chickens, each 63%; rye, 62%; corn, 60% and hogs and wool, each 57%.

Vets' Farm and Home Loans to Drop in County During 1960

SALEM—Oregon veterans' farm and home loans were granted to 11 veterans in Morrow county in 1959 in the amount of \$83,150.00. H C Saalfeld director of the State Veterans' Affairs, reported this week.

Starting this year, however, Saalfeld said, loans will be reduced about 65 percent because of a shortage of loan funds. This could mean that only 4 veterans in Morrow county will receive loans in the amount of \$30,750.00 during 1960, if the reduction were uniform statewide.

Actually, veterans' loan applications are being scheduled for funds statewide on a "first come, first served" basis. Loans for all of Oregon will be limited to about 120 a month, starting in April, as against the average of 430 loans granted each month last year.

Saalfeld said the money shortage will continue through 1960, because the state veterans' department has reached the constitutional limit of bonds it may issue to finance the program. It may now loan only the money it receives from veterans' monthly loan repayments, after paying operating expenses.

Whether the shortage continues next year will depend on the outcome of a measure on the ballot in next November's election to increase the limit of bonds that may be issued. The loan program requires no tax funds and is self-sustaining.

Since the state veterans' loan program started in 1945, a total of 62 veterans in Morrow county have borrowed \$381,200.00.
