**SCATTERED GOVERNMENT**

"The office of the chancellor of the State Board of Higher Education and the headquarters of the board should be in a 'neutral area', instead of in Eugene near the University of Oregon," Gov Mark Hatfield told Salem Lions Club members at a Marion Motor Hotel luncheon Thursday.

As other examples of scattered government that should be brought "home" to Salem he pointed to the Welfare Commission and Board of Health state headquarters. "These headquarters deal mostly with the counties, and they can do so in Salem just as well as in Portland," he continued.

When headquarters are scattered around the state you can't expect your governor to be racing around the state, keeping a check upon what they are doing. Good administration calls for proximity between the governor's office and all the departments, he indicated.

Comment of impressed legislators present, was that they had often wished all state government headquarters were in the capital city where department heads were immediately available and the workings of departments could be observed at any hour, instead of at a pre-arranged "showboat" period.

**PRIMARY FILINGS SLOW**  
 In past days when there were more registered Republicans than Democrats in a majority of the precincts of the state, the GOP boys took their time for filing. The habit was to wait and size up the opposition in their own party. Now their party tangents have eased off because of increasing Democratic registrations. The most of the sizing up is being done by the Democrats.

During the last two weeks the filings at the State Elections Division of the Secretary of State, were on a ratio of 7-to-4 with the Democrats showing a consistent day by day lead. If this ratio maintains until filing deadline the Democrats will have the longest primary ballot in Oregon history.

**PESTICIDE MEET**  
 The answer as to where agriculture stands today in use of pesticides or farm chemicals will be given attention at a meeting February 11 at Corvallis in the Home Economics auditorium, Oregon State College.

Conference spokesman for the federal food and drug administration, which precipitated the nationwide discussions on pesticide usage, will be Arnold Morton, assistant chief of the Seattle office. Other speakers will be D. W. Dean, USAD, San Francisco and J. D. Patterson, chief chemist, state department of agriculture. The conference is open to the public.

**FICTION WRITER DUE**  
 Arrangements have been completed to have the famed author of the Perry Mason stories, as

consultant for the statewide Conference on Crime Prevention which will be held in the Marion Motor Hotel at Salem, Feb. 18. He is Erle Stanley Gardner (not Earl, nor Earle), an attorney and former president of the California Bar Assn., who has written over 100 mystery stories and travel books, and has helped organize the "Court of Last Resort."

Gardner's books have earned more than \$40,000,000, some of them averaging 1,500,000 copies sold a year.

The conference will be the first of its kind to be held in the state and is being organized by Attorney General Robert Y. Thornton who advises that persons wishing to attend the conference should inform him to make reservations for them and the number in their party. Gardner will also speak to the Salem Kiwanis Club.

**VETERANS' LOANS CUT**  
 The volume of farm and home loans to veterans has been reduced to about one-third of the previous program which ended Monday, January 18, according to H C Sealfield, department director who clarifies the situation with the information that the department has reached its capacity to issue bonds to finance loans.

During 1959 the department granted 5,170 loans amounting to \$2 million dollars. It was a record year and exceeded the previous record in 1957 by 16 million.

The department, from now on, will be able to make only 120 loans a month, compared with a monthly average up to now of about 430 a month.

There will be a measure on the November election ballot to increase the limit on bonds that may be issued to the department.
