SKI TIPS FOR BEGINNERS

By Dr. ROBERT PFEIFFER
 Last week this column stated that the snow conditions at the new ski area were very good, and Sunday the 21st found six inches of dry powder snow on a firm base and skiing was excellent.

When a skier, novice or experienced, starts shopping for ski equipment, he will find the supply plentiful as well as varied and may have difficulty deciding what to buy. Four items of equipment are necessary for enjoying recreational skiing:

Boots—double construction, double laced with heavy stiff soles. Various types of straps are optional but not necessary. Prices start at about \$15.

Skis—solid hickory is good, but laminated are best. Steel edges are very important although not absolutely necessary. Plastic base-wax (on the bottoms of the skis) is very durable and can be applied at home.

Length of the skis depend primarily on the users weight and leg length, not their height. For a child up to about 100 pounds, a 36 to 48 inch ski is usually adequate. Adults up to 120 lbs—5 foot 6 inches to 6 feet; from 120 to 140 lbs—6 feet to 6 feet 9 inches; from 140 to 160 lbs—6 feet 9 inches to 7 feet 3 inches; from 160 to 190 lbs—7 feet 3 inches to 7 feet 6 inches. Adult beginners can deduct 12 inches from the above lengths. Prices start at \$10.

Bindings—these are metal devices for attaching the boot to the ski. Any type of simple safety binding that will automatically release in a fall that exerts a backward or rotary action. They may be a little inconvenient for the beginner, but they do provide excellent insurance against leg injuries.

Ski Poles—Steel is tougher and more durable than aluminum. Length should be about half-way between waist and shoulder of the user.

The novice is hard on equipment, especially skis and it is suggested that inexpensive equipment be purchased for the beginner and if the sport proves interesting, the more expensive types be purchased.

Next week, care and storage of equipment will be discussed, so until then, ski hell and we will see at the meeting Sunday afternoon.
