Saturday, I was quite impressed with the luncheon that the young girls prepared. The entire luncheon was a leaching device to give the girls experience in food preparation, the serving of food, and table manners.

Marjorie Baker served some "Appletos" as after-dinner tidbits. It was an unusual type of candy made from apple juice and gelatin. I thought you might like to try it—so here's the recipe.

Appletto

4 T. gelatine, 1 1/2 c. chopped walnuts, 1 c. cold apple juice, few drops rose flavoring (optional) 4 c. sugar.

Soak gelatine in cold apple juice for 10 minutes. Put 1 1/2 c. apple juice in a sauce pan with sugar and bring to a boil. Add gelatine and boil 15 minutes. Remove from stove, let cool till it starts to set. Stir in nuts and flavoring. Pour in dish, chill. Cut in squares and roll in powdered sugar.
