Pfc Lindstrom Takes Part in Maneuvers

Pfc Arthur Lindstrom serving in the 2nd Medium Tank Battalion, 1st Cavalry at Gelsen, Germany, the son of Mr and Mrs Franklin Lindstrom of Ione, recently participated in maneuvers of the Third Armored Division of the Seventh United States Army.

This division known as the Spearhead Division has just completed their 19th year and their 4th year with NATO. More than 6,000 men, representing every Spearhead Battalion participated in the mammoth review at Camp Pond, Hanau, Germany.

The Spearhead Division acquired its name at Omaha Beach in 1944. "You Will Spearhead the Attack" was a frequent mission given the division by Maj Gen J Lawton Collins, VIII Corps commanding general. The nickname stuck.

One of the major highlights this year for the Division was its participation in operation "Winter Shield" at Grafenwoehr, Germany. This exercise was conducted in bitter cold, snow and ice over rugged terrain. During this maneuver Spearheads were visited by delegations of French, Italian and Turkish army officers, who observed the various field maneuvers.

Mrs Gronewald, the former Jean Hayes, a niece of the Thompsons, is leaving soon with her family to make her home in Anchorage, Alaska.

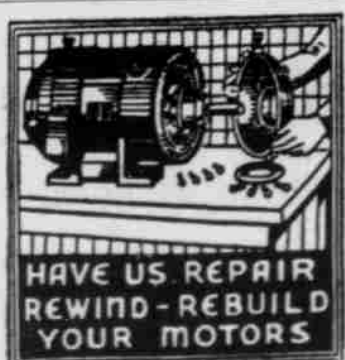
Judy Darnielle Feted At Bridal Shower
