Mustang pitcher Tom Green collected his fifth win of the season against no defeats. The Mustangs first scored in the third inning on two hits and a Tiger error. In the fifth inning the Mustangs collected four hits off Tiger pitcher Jerry Voss, which were good for four runs and an early shower for Voss.

Stanfield scored its only run in the sixth inning as the Tigers put together a walk, hit batter and then a single which scored a run.

The Heppner squad managed another run in the seventh due to a wild pitch. Final score of the game was 6-1 in favor of the Mustangs from Heppner. Batteries: Heppner, Green and Glass; Stanfield, Voss, Grogan and Butler.

In two non-league games last week the Mustangs lost both to Umatilla and Condon. Tuesday afternoon the Umatilla Vikings scored six runs in the first inning and coasted thru the game. Tom Green hit a triple and a home run for the Mustangs final score was 8-3.

Umatilla high track and field team took top honors at a triangular meet held in Umatilla Saturday, with a total of 75 1/2 points.

Heppner placed second with a total of 56 1/2, then Pilot Rock who had 21.

Tom Driscoll of Heppner was top scorer of the meet with 20 1/2 points. He placed first in the 100, 120 high hurdles, broad jump and second in the 180 low hurdles. Roy Ames of Umatilla was second with 19 1/2 points.
