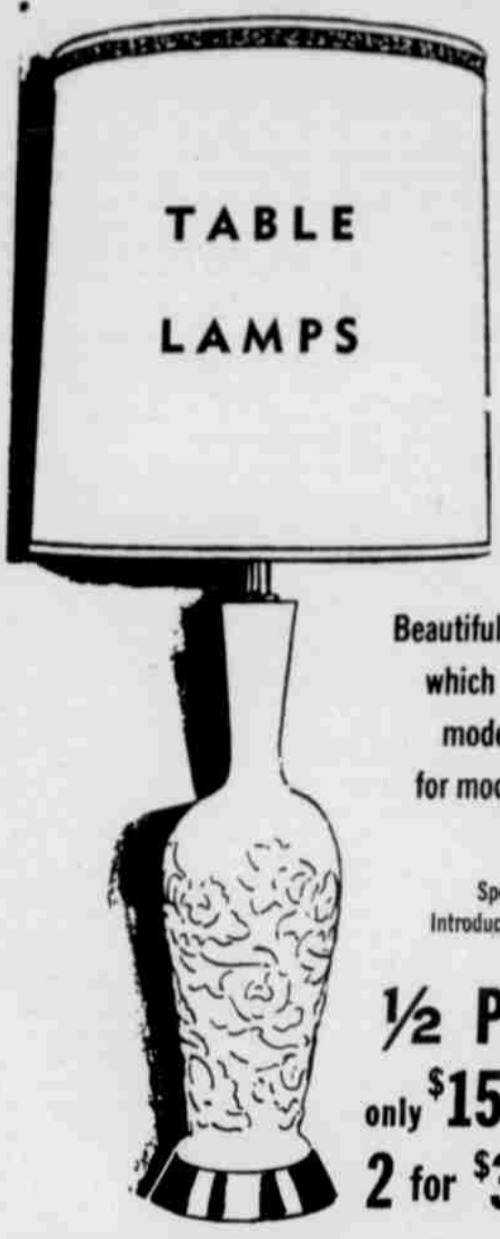

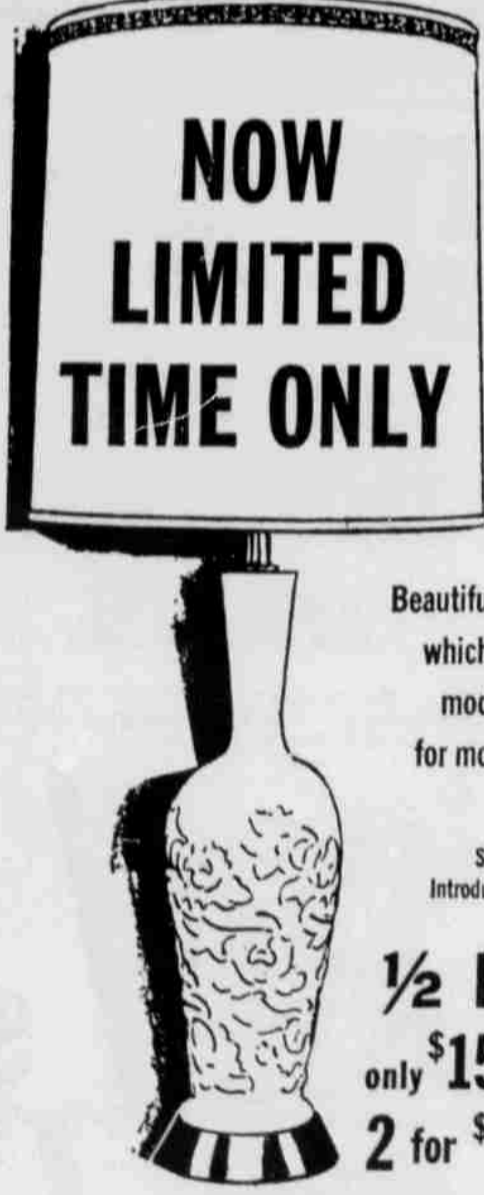

This means that more light is reflected back to the eye from the facets of a diamond than a similarly cut stone having a lower index of refraction. Commonly it is colorless, but may be found in almost every color. The vast majority of diamonds marketed today are of South African origin, although Borneo, Brazil, British Guiana, and Venezuela also produce diamonds and a few have been found in the United States in
