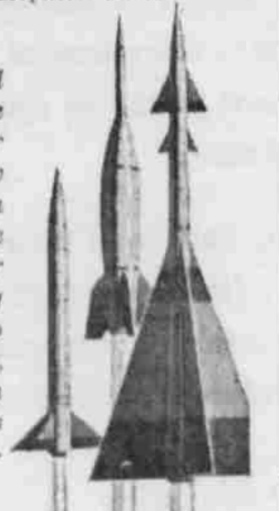


WHAT'S DOING
