

COUNTY COURT PROCEEDINGS

Animal Research Reports Set at May 27 Program

Eastern Oregon livestock men will have an opportunity to be brought up to date on animal research in the state May 27 at the Eastern Oregon Branch Experiment Station's field day.

The program will be from 10 a. m. to 3 p. m. at the station near Union. Dr. J. C. Miller, head of dairy and animal husbandry at Oregon State College, will summarize current research in dairy, beef cattle, sheep, swine, horses, mink and small animals at both the college and its branch experiment stations.

Dr. J. E. Oldfield, OSC animal husbandman, will report on recent studies of selenium as a cure for white muscle disease. He also will talk on use of pelleted and wafered feeds for

beef cattle, improvement of barley feeds for sheep by supplementation, and use of enzymes in swine feeding.

The wool program in Oregon will be explained by Dr. C. W. Fox, OSC animal husbandman.

Persons attending will have a chance to tour the station to see steers in the feed lot, pens of Columbia and Targhee rams and ewes, crossbred lambs, and grass plots. Dr. J. A. McArthur, station superintendent, and F. V. Pumphrey, agronomist, will tell about work at the station.

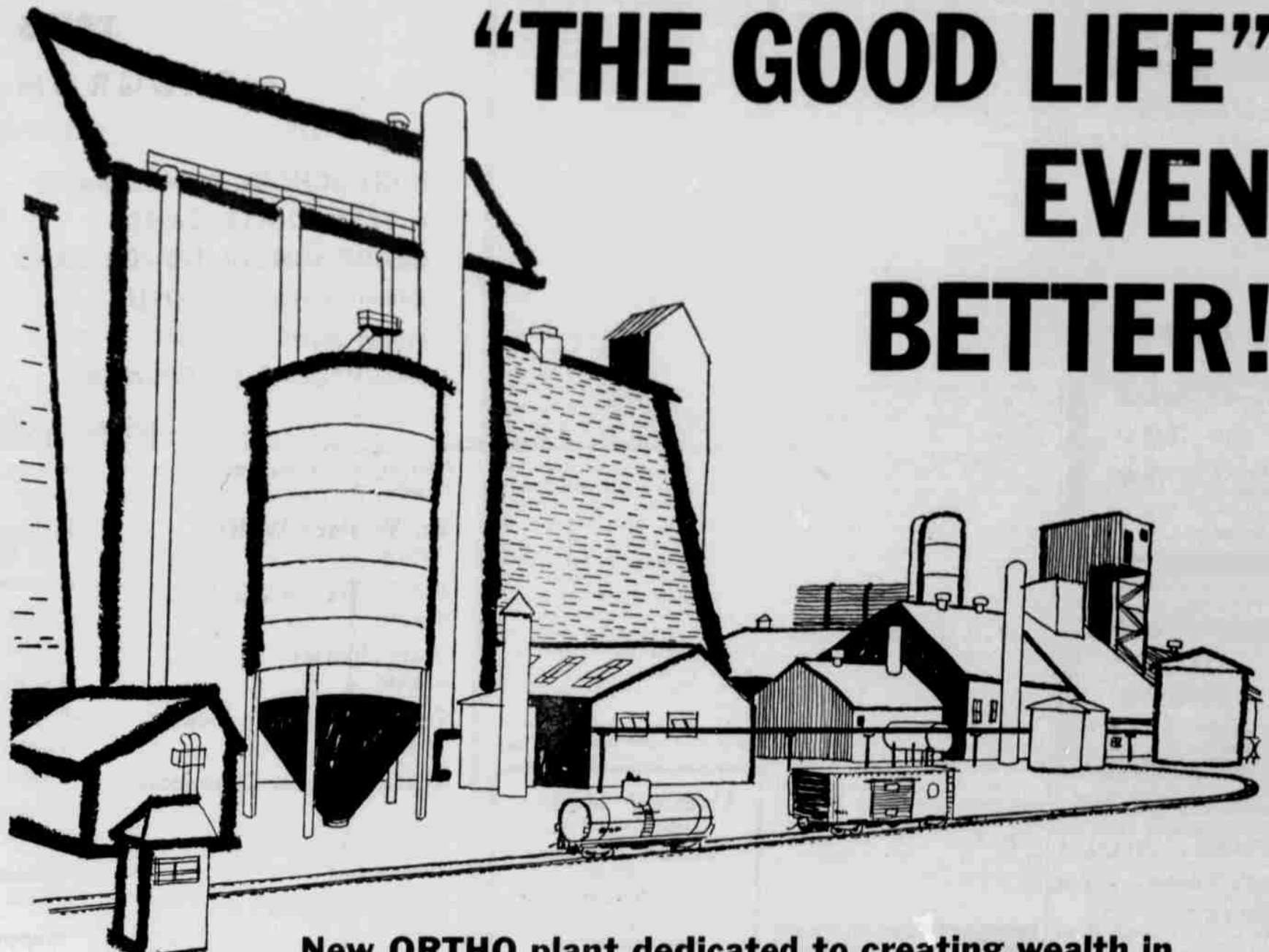
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
