Effect of Soil Bank Conservation Reserve Described

Going into the 1960 crop season, the Conservation Reserve is having substantial impact on the acreage and production of surplus crops, the U S Department of Agriculture says in its annual report on the operation of the Soil Bank program. With approximately 300,000 contracts in effect and more than 28 million acres under contract, the report shows, cropland which has been contributing heavily to the surplus build-up in recent years is being withheld from production and devoted to conservation uses under long-term contracts.

During the 1959-60 period, the department reports, farmer participation in the Conservation Reserve more than doubled. The acreage of cropland withheld from production almost tripled, and the percentage of "whole farms" under contract grew to more than two-thirds of the total.

Under the Conservation Reserve, farmers voluntarily enter contracts to hold cropland out of production and devote it to conservation uses. After four years of experience, the department says, it is apparent that large numbers of farmers will participate in a program of this type. In each of the last two years, farmers have offered land for the program well in excess of the amount that could be accepted.
