She told of the past ten years in child welfare and that the organizations have given \$50,000 to the Heart Association for the purpose of a grant to learn more about rheumatic heart disease.

Nine years ago they gave \$25,000 grant to the National Mental Health organization and records show that hundreds of thousands of dollars have been contributed to the National Foundation of infantile paralysis.

Many more organizations and associations have benefited from contributions from the Legion and the Auxiliary, with a great amount of this being derived from poppy sales.
