Area Bank Debits Show 20% Jump Over Year Ago

UNIVERSITY OF OREGON, Eugene. Bank debits for the Pendleton area including Morrow and Umatilla counties decreased by 15.2 percent in February, 1960 as compared to January, 1960 and increased by 20.2 percent a year ago.

Debits for February, 1960 totaled \$30,570,279; for January, 1960 the total was \$36,047,240; and for February, 1959 the total amounted to \$25,420,976.

Oregon, with 190 banks reporting, had a decrease in bank debits in February, 1960 of 10.7 percent over January, 1960 and an increase of 10.2 percent over February, 1959. Total debits for Oregon in February, 1960 came to \$1,841,766,044; January, 1960 totaled \$2,061,867,516; and February a year ago reached \$1,671,071,881.

Bank debits represent the dollar value of checks drawn against the deposit accounts of individuals and business firms. Bank debits are considered good indicators of current business activity. Each month the Bureau of Business Research at the Uni-

versity of Oregon collects data on bank debits from Oregon banks and branches.
