**Farm Prices Move Upward, OSC Reports**

Farm prices showed plenty of spring zip in Oregon last month, more than making up for losses suffered during February, reports Mrs. Elvira Horrell, extension agricultural economist at Oregon State College.  
 The upturn in prices received by Oregon farmers in March was enough to push the farm price index in this state to the highest point since mid-1953, Mrs. Horrell found as she studied reports from the U S Department of Agriculture. All in all, Oregon farm prices rose 2 percent last month.  
 Livestock prices accounted for the biggest share of this rise, ending up 3 percent above February of this year. Prices paid for crops also moved up a little. As a result, Oregon farm prices stand just a shade above March, 1959.

Nationally, prices received by farmers moved up even more sharply than in Oregon, largely due to even greater strength in meat-animal markets, Mrs. Horrell noted. Livestock prices moved up 5 percent, crop prices edged up 1 percent, and the combined index of all national farm prices gained 3 percent over a month ago.  
 But while national farm prices now stand at the highest level since last July, they are still nearly 2 percent lower than a year ago, Mrs. Horrell said.  
 Cost of things farmers use for both farm operation and living expenses gained one-third of a percent in March, and now stand 1 percent higher than a year ago. But with prices received by farmers up 3 percent, and prices paid by farmers up only 1 percent, farm product purchasing power improved during the month ending March 15, Mrs. Horrell pointed out.
