## C of C Asked For Help in Plan For Controlling Wrecks

District attorney Robert B. Abrams Monday asked the Chamber of Commerce for any help its members might give in finding a way to patrol highways in the county with a view toward preventing or controlling car accidents.

Abrams told of Sunday morning's wreck near Ruggs that took the life of a Condon man, and said that this was the third single-car fatal accident to occur so far this year in the county. He said all police officers are making every effort to patrol roads, but that it is physically impossible to be everywhere at once.

One chamber member, O. W. Cutsforth of Lexington, recommended that traffic violator's cars be governed at 50 miles an hour and that decals denoting a previous offense be placed on the car for a period of time. He said he had made the recommendation many times previously.

A special chamber committee will study the problem.

The group heard Miss Rhoda Campbell, Scottish IFYE delegate who has spent the last two weeks at the Randall Martin ranch. She showed slides of her home land where she is a school teacher. In answer to questions, she said that juvenile delinquency is a world-wide problem, not one that is confined just to America. She recommended the problem be solved with less psychology and more common sense, saying she thought adults do too much for their children and that boredom at home is a major cause of the troubles.

Miss Janice Martin, at whose home Miss Campbell has been staying, told of the many places and events that have been part of Miss Campbell's itinerary while in Morrow county. They have included a rodeo, harvesting operations, 4-H summer camp, and others.
