Munkers and Driscoll each got singles with Gray getting a double to score them. The All-Stars got 3 more hits in the last 3 innings but couldn't get the rally going. Carl Bauman pitched for the All-Stars 5 2/3 innings allowing 5 runs on 7 hits, 4 strike outs and 3 walks. Don Munkers relieved had 3 runs on 1 hit, 1 strike out and 1 walk. The fielders had an excellent record with 13 put outs.

Pitching for the Nationals were Northland and Schiewe relieving in the 1st after 7 men to allow 5 runs on 7 hits, 3 strike outs and 7 walks. The fielders had 15 put outs. Munkers got 2 for 3 for the All-Stars and for the Nationals, Rabb got 2 for 3 and Northland got 2 for 4.

## GOP Congressional Nominee, Ron Phair To Stump County

Among those representing Eastern Oregon at the Republican convention in Chicago this week is Ron Phair, Republican candidate for Congress from Oregon's 2nd district. Phair is a Klamath Falls farmer.

He has said that he thinks fiscal responsibility and high taxation will be the key factors in the campaign in this district and has said that the Democratic platform is "exciting, but it does not say how it proposes to pay for the things it advocates." Phair is against higher taxes and characterizes incumbent Al Ullman as "a nice fellow but proven by the record to be a tax-and-spend boy."

Ron Bayes, Milton-Freewater, Phair's campaign manager visited in Heppner last Saturday and said that "according to plan Ron Phair will visit Heppner right after the convention. He's going to stump here vigorously and carry the issues to Morrow county. Ron is convinced that fiscal responsibility is as vital to Morrow County citizens as it is to him and that they, too, are adamant against higher taxes."

Alvin Spencer Akers, 87, died July 18 at Aumsville, Oregon. He was born Jan 12, 1873 in Leon, Decatur county Iowa and came to Oregon in 1887. He was married to Nellie Vaughn Nov 14, 1897 and she passed away in 1945. He married Rose Benton, who survives him, in June 1946.

Mr Akers farmed in Morrow county for many years and later bought a hardware store in Heppner. He moved to Portland in 1924.

He is survived by his wife; two daughters Blanche Barlow, Heppner, and Alma Gilliam, Portland; granddaughters Marie Warner, Milwaukie, and Lucille Walker, Eugene. He also leaves four grandsons.
