

# Rites Held at Boardman for Glen Carpenter

Funeral services will be held at 2 p m Thursday at the Boardman Community Church for Glen Carpenter, 62, who died at the Good Shepherd hospital in Hermiston Tuesday following a heart attack suffered a short time before while shopping in Hermiston.

Mr Carpenter was born in Cedar Point, Kansas May 30, 1898, the son of Mr and Mrs Louis Carpenter, and came to Boardman in 1917 with his parents. He was married to Hazel Bell in 1948, and they have made

their home here since, where he farmed and in later years he and his wife had a motel business.

He is survived by his widow, Hazel of Boardman; one brother, Ray Carpenter of Florence, Kans; and two nephews, Delbert Carpenter of Boardman, and Orville Carpenter of Umatilla.
