(Continued from Page 2) additional feed and turned out only in the evening, corralled each morning.  
 In order to gain the greatest income from the farm flock, as well as the range band, it is important to get off a big marketable lamb early in the season when prices are higher. It is difficult for the range flock operator to breed as early as the farm flock owner, however, many of the other management practices can be followed for early fast gains. The farm flock owner that breeds now can sell his lambs in June before pastures begin to dry up will find that his income can be increased considerably. It is important that this extra care including flushing of ewes and the care of the ram be practiced if the sheep man is to gain top income from his sheep flock.

kind of prices on many of the commodities which we grow in Morrow county it is again important that we follow strictly top management practices.  
 Ranchers can take advantage of price support programs to protect their investments and to get at least guaranteed parity prices from those commodities supported. We mean by this CCC loans on grain and filling for wool incentive payments. The supports are provided as a part of our national economy and are for the farmers use the same as incentives, subsidies and supports to the many industries throughout our nation.

Some farm prices appear to be strengthening recently. The above loan price of market wheat this month no doubt will change the picture of this commodity which stood at 71% at the end of July. Cattlemen have been encouraged during the past week with quite a bit of activity as far as buyers are concerned. Several buyers have been in the county and while few calves have been sold, offers are beginning to shape up to somewhat near the price that growers can see some profit in the cattle business this year. With some heavy yearling steers sold for 23 cents and some offers for calves of 25 and 27 cents the picture is beginning to change.

One of the buyers in the county is Newell Anderson, Othello, Washington who incidentally was featured in the May 1960 story on steam rolled barley in the Far Journal. Visiting with Mr Anderson, we were pleased to hear that he had purchased some calves for his feedlot last year which came from Morrow county. His interest in our calves stemmed from the efficient gains which were made by them in the feedlot. One of these bunches of calves were from the Charlie Monagle ranch near Heppner. While many of the calves for the Anderson's feedlot have been bought in the Okanogan country, he is interested in Morrow county calves that can be purchased by October 1 in order to take advantage of fall pastures before going into the feedlot.
